




Adult Forum: Evolution, Creationism, and God



Join us on Sunday, May 3 and Sunday, May 10 at 9:30 a.m. in the Sanctuary for an adult forum on Evolution, Creationism, and God. One current topic of debate in this country is whether creationism or intelligent design should be taught in public schools along with evolution. Come to these two adult forums to learn more about the views of Christians supporting creationism and/or intelligent design and the evidence for and against evolution. We will discuss how the debate is rooted in some of the central tenets of some Christians faith, such as how one views the Bible. We will also discuss whether belief in creation by God is incompatible with evolution and how our views about these issues can affect our belief in God. Led by Don Rowen, Professor in Biology at UNO.

Summer Book Study by Ruth Manning

The Shack, by William P. Young, is a story that wrestles with the timeless question: "Where is God in a world so filled with unspeakable pain?" The story of a young girl who was abducted and brutally murdered during a family vacation will challenge you in many ways. It's a book you'll have a hard time putting down.



This summer, I will facilitate a discussion group of this book that many at Lord of Love have already read. Tentatively, I'm planning a 6-week study to be held at church; probably from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m. on a weeknight. There will soon be a survey form at the Information Center in the narthex to determine the best time and day for the study and whether it should be weekly or biweekly.

You can pick up a copy of the book at Parables and chain bookstores, or you can get it at a bargain price online on E-bay, Books-A-Million, Amazon, or www.christianbook.com or at Costco and Sam's. Regular price is \$15.00, but I've found it for about \$9.00.

Do you have crafts or other projects that you need dedicated time to work on? Do you enjoy the company of others?



Property Committee Meeting Minutes



Spring Cleanup Day is scheduled for May 16 at 8:00 a.m. We will be doing our usual exterior raking, trimming, mulching, and sprucing up the church grounds. Any additional exterior or interior work that will be done will be mentioned in the church bulletin. Hope you can give us a few hours: the more, the easier.

Craig Pennell met with John Mayberry, Lighting Specialist, from Echo Lighting to take lighting level measurements in the sanctuary and to discuss fixtures style and types and dimming options. John is obtaining cost information on one fixture as a starting point in determining what the total lighting scheme and the associated costs might be.

Elmer Howard of Elmer's Lock and Safe Service has provided an estimate for re-keying the locks of the church. Once the locks have been re-keyed, we will be issuing new keys to those who need them. We will keep everyone posted on when that happens so those who need access the church have a new key.

Stewardship

In a recent survey that was done with about 10 percent of Lord of Love members, one of the comments that came back is that we only seem to emphasize giving money during a few weeks each fall. Unfortunately, that probably is very true.

The truth is that our focus should be much broader than just money. God is interested in the stewardship of our time as well. We are each given the same 168 hours each week. How do we use the time we have? We all need time to sleep, eat, and work each day, but how much of each week do we devote to the Lord? If our only time spent is the 1 hour a week at worship, is that the kind of stewardship of your time that is pleasing to the Lord? That would involve about 0.6 percent of our time each week.



The average gift of money by ELCA members to the church is about 2 percent of income. What would happen if we gave an equal portion of our time? That represents less than 3 ½ hours of our time each week. That could be about ½ an hour a day spent in prayer, meditation, and Bible study. I know there are several who give that much time or more, but what if each of us were to spend just 2 hours more each week doing activities that support the Lord's work? Can you imagine the impact that could have? If we spent 200 to 300 hours a week in prayer as a congregation that we are not spending now? If we had 200 more hours spent on projects for WELCA or Men in Mission? Or Habitat or our garden project? Or stewardship or Sunday School?

Giving from our purse is needed and is a great way to respond to God's love. Giving of our time may be an even greater gift.

COUNCIL REPORT & TRANSITION/CALL PROCESS UPDATE

April 2009 Council Report by Don Rowen, Council Vice-President

The Lord of Love council did not meet during April, but the following is information about ongoing or upcoming activities of the council and the church:

- **Appreciative Inquiry Sessions**

The Vision and Coordination committee and Pastor Bob set dates for four Appreciative Inquiry meetings. We decided to hold the meetings on Thursday, June 4, 11, 18, and 25 starting at 6:00 p.m., with a meal served at the beginning. These meetings were recommended by Pastor Bob and Pastor Laaker to help us with our transition process. Please try to attend as many meetings as possible. Each meeting will discuss different eras in Lord of Love's history. These discussions will help all our members understand Lord of Love's past and the many positive things Lord of Love has done. These sessions will also help us figure out what type of church we want to be in the future.

- **Worship Enrichment Ministry Team**

In March, the council decided to form a Worship Enrichment Ministry Team. The goal of this committee is to consider what we could do to enrich worship life at Lord of Love. This team will study what it means to worship and how churches and people worship using a study guide entitled "Worship in Healthy, Effective Congregations" developed by Herb Miller, a noted scholar on church organizations. The team will meet for about 9 months and will report back to the council and congregation. We are seeking to form a team consisting of members of different ages and lengths of membership at Lord of Love to get a diversity of points of view about worship. The Vision and Coordination committee will form this team in May. If you are interested in serving on this team, contact Pastor Bob, Doug Aden, or Don Rowen.

- **Worship during Summer**

We decided to have one worship service at 9:00 a.m. during the summer months. The single worship schedule will begin on May 24, Memorial Day weekend, and run through September 6, Labor Day weekend. The reasoning was to have one well-attended worship service. In the past, some of the summer worship services were sparsely attended and lacked the energy to be as enriching as a well-attended worship service. A breakfast will usually follow the worship service to allow fellowship time.

- **New Council Structure**

The Vision and Coordination committee is seeking to evaluate how the new council/committee structure is working and to decide how to proceed next year. We have made some minor adjustments to include more groups in the Strategic Planning Meeting, including a representative from the Vision and Coordination committee, the Women of the ELCA, Men's Ministry, and the youth sponsor, to make sure all the major groups that are planning activities at Lord of Love are part of the Strategic Planning Committee. The feeling of the Vision and Coordination committee is that we will probably continue with the trial through next year before deciding whether to adopt the structure permanently, which would require changes to the constitution.

COUNCIL REPORT & TRANSITION/CALL PROCESS UPDATE

Bits and Pieces by Doug Aden, Council President

Because of the experimental Council and Strategic Planning Committee structure currently being tried, this is the first time that I have written this article without having just attended a Council meeting. So, we are depending upon each committee to provide updates on their activities in *The Love Letter*.

At the last Vision and Coordination meeting, we did discuss the new structure, how it is working, and the timeline for making a recommendation. In September, the Nominating Committee will begin seeking candidates for the various Council positions. We felt that we have not had enough experience with this format to make a recommendation. Our decision was to keep the Council structure in the format defined in the Constitution but to continue experimenting with the Strategic Planning Committee. By the November Congregational Meeting we should have a plan for next year, and in 2010, there should be enough experience with the structure to make a recommendation.

I have couple of observations or questions about this committee structure. Is Lord of Love big enough to have a Council and a Strategic Planning Committee? We would need to find five additional individuals to be on one or the other of the committees. The Constitution delegates specific responsibilities to the Council. If there is a Strategic Planning Committee working, can the Council do its job. An advantage of this structure is not having to attend so many Council meetings, which in theory gives more time to perform the committee's task, but do we lose communication in the process?

Pastor Bob has been with us for 8 months helping us work through the transition process, and I am satisfied with what has been accomplished. I think we will have a Call Committee in place by the end of the year or right after the beginning of next year. While this can be exciting, I am apprehensive because this will be one of the most important decisions that Lord of Love will make and it will affect what happens to our congregation. So we really have to know what we as a congregation want to be, want to do, and the type of Pastor we want to call.

One of the processes that will help us define who we are will be the Appreciative Inquiry meetings that will be held on Thursdays in June. Vision and Coordination encourages you to attend as many of these meetings as you can. After these meetings are completed, we will have visioning sessions in the fall, when we will develop a vision for Lord of Love.



I attended a "Congregational Leadership in Anxious Times" seminar with Peter Steinke. Several times during his presentation, Mr. Steinke referred to the importance of looking at a Congregation's history in determining its plan for the future. He also stated that that one of the most important criteria for a healthy congregation was its focus on Mission. The Appreciative Inquiry meetings and the visioning meetings will help determine our focus, our vision, and our mission.



At a recent Vision and Coordination Meeting, we asked ourselves the question "Does Lord of Love celebrate when we worship?" My answer was no; the other members were more positive. Another congregation celebrated Pentecost by having four microphones set up in each corner of the Sanctuary and the gospel being read at the same time in four different languages.

For the prayers, the congregation formed a huge circle, held hands, and faced inward and said prayers for their congregation. Then they turned around held hands and prayed for their community. So there are many ways to celebrate. Does Lord of Love celebrate? We have reasons to celebrate, but do we? Let me know what you think.


