PASTOR'S PAGE

Take in the Five Senses this Lent by Brian Lund, Council President

Dear Friends in Christ.

We've entered into the journey of Lent, and I'm curious about the topic for our Wednesday Lenten services, "Making Sense of Lent."
I understand that it will focus on how the five senses help us learn more about God.

I was interested enough about this topic to ask my old pal Google for some Bible references related to the five senses: sight, hearing, taste, smell, touch. I think I've hit on some verses that you probably won't hear about this Lent. However, these may still have some value in defining our relationships with God and each other.

Sight – God wants us to be blind to the differences in race, gender, and economic stature of the people around us: Galatians 3:28 "There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is no male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus."

Hearing – We often wonder what God's plan is for us. Through prayer and study, we listen to God's call to serve and be Christ to others. Romans 10:17 "So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ."

Taste – Often coupled with smell, taste is usually associated with food. But we often have such strong feelings about things that "we can almost taste them". Here are a couple of verses with similar advice regarding a right relationship with God and others. Proverbs 20:17 "Food gained by fraud tastes sweet to a man, but he ends up with a mouth full of gravel." 1 Peter 2:1-3 "Therefore, rid yourselves of all malice and all deceit, hypocrisy, envy, and slander of every kind. Like newborn babies, crave pure spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow up in your salvation, now that you have tasted that the Lord is good."

Smell – I recall that one of our friends from college could not smell things. The loss of this sense could be helpful at times, but I'd consider it a very significant handicap. From Paul's letter to the church in Corinth, we learn of the sweet smell of the knowledge of Christ. 2 Corinthians 2:14-15 "But thanks be to God, who always leads us in triumphal procession in Christ and through us spreads everywhere the fragrance of the knowledge of him. For we are to God the aroma of Christ among those who are being saved and those who are perishing."

Touch – When considering this final sense, I was reminded of the tune "Don't Touch That." As parents, we were constantly telling our very young kids this same thing. The books of Leviticus and Numbers are full of examples of "don't touch that" wording. But when it comes to Jesus in the Gospels, people were begging to touch and be touched by Him. Mark 6:56 "And wherever he went—into villages, towns or countryside—they placed the sick in the marketplaces. They begged him to let them touch even the edge of his cloak, and all who touched him were healed."

I encourage you to take in the five senses this Lent through participation in Wednesday and Sunday worship services as well as the special services of Holy Week. Come and be fed by the meat and potato lessons of the season. Don't skip the main course and show up only for the dessert of Easter.

By the way, there are some great Lenten meditations available through the Lutheran School of Theology, Luther Seminary, and the ELCA websites. Dig in and feast on these additional opportunities for reflection.

The Love Letter 4 March 2010

Worship During the Season of Lent

The season of Lent began on February 17, Ash Wednesday, and continues until April 4, Easter Sunday. Lent is 40 days long to remember the amount of time Jesus spent in the wilderness being tempted by the devil at the beginning of his ministry. If you've ever gotten out a calendar and counted the days, you'll discover that from Ash Wednesday to Easter, there are actually 46 days. This is because Sundays are not technically counted as part of Lent; they are "mini Easters" to be celebrated all through the year.



Our worship on Sundays this Lent will use the same theme as our congregation's theme for the year: "Building on Faith to Serve." We will continue looking at ways to discover God's calling to act on our faith in order to serve others.

The Sunday before Easter is called either Sunday of the Passion or Palm Sunday. Sometimes people wonder why we recount the entire Passion story when we're just going to cover the same territory again on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. As I was listening to the story last year, I was struck by how many stories get left out if we jump straight from Palm Sunday to texts for Thursday and Friday. Peter's denial of Jesus, for example, is one story we would miss altogether. Christians have been marking the Sunday before Easter with a procession of palms followed by the full passion narrative since the seventh century. In this month's *Lutheran Women Today*, Jennifer Ollikainen writes, "The two shouts of the crowds in the gospel accounts proclaimed on Passion Sunday, 'Hosanna!' and 'Crucify!' exemplify the paradox that is central to our Christian faith, the paschal mystery. Jesus Christ brings victory through suffering, greatness through humility, life through death."

For our Wednesday evening worhip services, "Making Sense of Lent," we will explore ways to deepen our relationship with God using all of our senses.

- March 3 Journey into Touching. We share and show love by touching.
- March 10 Journey into Tasting. Taste and see that the Lord is good!
- March 17 Journey into Seeing. Look around you and see if you can see the evidence of God at work in the world.
- March 24 Journey into Smelling. Scents evoke memories and emotions more than any other sense.
- April 1 Maundy Thursday. We remember the Last Supper.
- April 2 Good Friday. We contemplate Jesus' suffering and death and what it means for us.

Habitat for Humanity


For the past several years, Lord of Love has partnered with other churches in the ELF coalition, the community, and Habitat family partners to build or rehab a house. Lord of Love will be participating in the ELF coalition again this year. We will be doing a rehab house again this year, which is located at 3227 North 40th Avenue. We will start working on the house beginning the weekend of April 10. We will work all day on Saturday and Sunday afternoons. Lord of Love will be responsible for providing a meal on a Saturday, volunteers to donate their time and skills, and financial support. The ELF coalition needs to raise \$80,000.00 to rehab this year's house. To finance the house, the ELF coalition will get grant money, but the largest amount of the money comes from the congregations in the ELF coalition. Thrivent Financial is a major contributor to Habitat for Humanity. The more Lutherans and the more Thrivent Financial members that volunteer their time and skills, the more Thrivent Financial contributes financially. Everyone at Lord of Love has the ability to contribute to Habitat for Humanity. If you do not feel you have a useful skill to volunteer, a financial contribution of any amount is beneficial. If you are willing to volunteer, there is always some skill that can be useful. Habitat for Humanity is also a great place to learn new skills and to meet other people in our community of Christ. In the next couple of months, we will be asking for volunteers and financial support for this local ministry.

COUNCIL REPORT & TRANSITION/CALL PROCESS UPDATE

February 2010 Council Report by Don Rowen, Council Vice-President

A Congregational Meeting was held on February 7, 2010, and the items of business were as follows:

- Reviewed reports from each ministry of the church as published in the annual report.
- Reviewed year-end financial status. We had a deficit of almost \$6,000 for the year but still had money
 in the bank account.
- Elected 2 members (Josh and Carissa Combes) to attend the Nebraska Synod meeting in June.
- Elected 3 members to the Nominating Committee.
- Elected two members to the Endowment Committee.
- Reviewed the current council organization and work.
- Showed the goals of the council this year.
- Discussed the status of the call process. The Council has started to prepare the Congregation Profile, which we hope to complete by mid-April. The Council will bring forward a slate of candidates for the Call Committee to be elected at a special congregation meeting in mid-April.
- Had a light lunch and had members give their responses to five questions for the Congregation Profile:
 - 1. What are the top gifts the new pastor should have?
 - 2. What are the top five ministry tasks on which the new pastor should focus?
 - 3. What are three ways the Omaha community has been challenged in the last 3 to 5 years?
 - 4. What are three changes that have occurred within Lord of Love in the last 3 to 5 years?
 - 5. What are the members of Lord of Love excited about right now?

The Strategic Planning Committee met on February 16, 2010. The Strategic Planning Committee consists of the council members, the pastor, the youth director, and representatives of Women of Love and the Men's ministry group. The minutes of the meeting are summarized as follows:

- Brian Lund reviewed the different functions and activities that will occur at the Strategic Planning meetings versus the Council meetings. The Strategic Planning meetings will focus on longer range planning (3 to 12 months) and discussion of concerns, problems, and goals and how we might address concerns and attain our goals.
- We decided to have one topic as a major focus of each Strategic Planning meeting and decided that the topic of the next meeting in April will be the Education ministry.
- We discussed a long-range planning calendar that Brian Lund developed and asked each ministry to work on adding its upcoming activities to the calendar.
- Don Rowen gave an update on the progress on the Congregation Profile. A list of all the questions and information needed has been developed, and council members or committees have been assigned to supply answers or information. The council reviewed the responses to the five questions that the congregation members answered at the Congregational meeting. The council also answered another series of questions to attempt to describe the characteristic of the congregation and were asked to supply additional information by March 1. We will also prepare a booklet that describes Lord of Love along with answering the questions in the Congregation Profile.

COUNCIL REPORT & TRANSITION/CALL PROCESS UPDATE

From the Council President - March 2010 by Brian Lund, Council President

Romans 12:12 (NRSV) "Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer."

This is a time of hope and excitement for Lord of Love. We are anxious for the call process to begin and be completed. Patience and prayer are needed as we enter this important activity for our congregation.

The council is hard at work on the Congregation Profile. The profile describes our congregation to candidate pastors. It documents who we are and what type of ministry we want to have at Lord of Love. Input from last month's annual meeting and summaries from Pastor Bob's appreciative inquiry sessions are being included in the profile. As we get nearer to completion, we will ask for your review and feedback. Once we complete the profile, then we will submit it to the Nebraska Synod and form our call committee.

The council will be the nominating committee for the call committee. We plan to have a committee of six people, three men and three women, two each from the following age groups: under 30, 30 to 50, and over 50. The council will identify potential call committee members. A job description that defines expectations, time commitment, and other basics of being a call committee member will be drafted. Each candidate will be asked to prayerfully consider serving on the call committee. The slate of candidates will be presented to the congregation at a special meeting, most likely in April.



Your prayers and encouragement to the council during this busy time of planning, discerning, writing, and general preparation for the call process are greatly needed and appreciated.

This calendar is intended to help with the communication of upcoming activities and increase the potential for our council committees to collaborate in carrying out the ongoing ministries of our congregation.

I am thankful for the great people that are serving with me on the church council. We are blessed to have these capable people leading our congregation in this time of transition. Please thank them for their service and lift them up in your prayers.






