Moments of Pause by Pastor Brad

Throughout Lent, we were encouraged to take "Moments of Pause" to reflect on Jesus, prayer, God's wonder, and serving others. These moments of pause were to help us look inwardly at our relationship with God as we approached the cross and the resurrection.

Easter has come. Christ is risen! But our "Moments of Pause" are not over. Like the disciples who gathered after hearing from the women that the tomb was empty, we too take a moment to ponder what this message means for us.

Jesus' resurrection shows that his love for us is stronger than death and his love for us is experienced in the times of stillness that we spend with him. As the disciples walked on the road to Emmaus, they experienced Jesus' presence. As the disciples gathered "behind locked doors," Jesus appeared to them. Mary encountered Jesus at the tomb as she tried to find him. Even after Thomas doubted, Jesus revealed himself as the risen Christ. Jesus'


presence was revealed to those who sought him out, who desired to spend more time with him.

Henri Nouwen wrote: "O Lord, I know now that it is in silence, in a quiet moment, in a forgotten corner that you will meet me, call me by name and speak to me a word of peace. It is in my stillest hour that you become the risen Lord to me."

May your Easter be filled with moments spent with the risen Christ as he reveals himself to you in moments of stillness.

In your moments of pause, pray: Lord, the life you have given me and the new life you have won for me are treasures that will never decay. Help me to appreciate them deeply, today and through the Easter Season.

Along with the 25th anniversary of ELCA, the Women of the ELCA celebrate their 25th anniversary. Join us for the adult forum on Sunday, April 7, at 9:15 a.m. to learn how the Women of the ELCA have changed, how they have grown, and how they have affirmed their gifts.

The Women of the ELCA are called to discipleship in Jesus Christ and are empowered by the Holy Spirit. They commit to engage in ministry and action, and promote healing and wholeness in the church, the society, and the world. How can this been done? Ministry is for all of us to do—men, women, and children.

W/ELCA is most likely thought of as starting in the kitchen serving church potluck luncheons and funeral lunches. Even though we continue to do those events, we now reach across the globe bringing health and wholeness. We provide seed grant monies enabling women to continue their integrated agricultural projects to farm 50 acres of donated land to grow cash crops—cocoa, bananas, and capsule. Another seed grant was planted in the form of funding the purchase of a four-wheel drive vehicle enabling the women to monitor the farming, go for training, travel to market, etc. Through the Women of the ELCA, women are helped; they help their communities: the women, the men, and the children.



The W/ELCA logo—with the cross, water, and a white lily—identifies women as children of God: baptized, forgiven, adopted into God's family, full of grace and hope in eternal life. It is a reminder of the growth, beauty, and vitality that rises out of that life-giving baptismal water. It is also a reminder of the mission of the church to "Go, therefore, make disciples of all nations; baptize them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" (Matthew 28:19).

We invite you to attend the April 7 adult forum; to learn, share, and celebrate our history; and to learn of the works we are doing today to help everyone. This adult forum is for **everyone**! Come celebrate our anniversary with us and enjoy some cake.

The ELCA Malaria Campaign

The ELCA Malaria Campaign, an initiative rolled out by the 2011 ELCA Churchwide Assembly that works with Lutheran churches in Africa to prevent, treat, and contain the disease by 2015, is helping the Lutheran Communion in Southern Africa to create new programs in Angola, Mozambique, Malawi, Zambia, and Zimbabwe. These programs are meant to change the way people think about malaria prevention by reshaping culture altogether.

We cannot ignore the fact that within a poor socioeconomic group, there is a higher possibility for a more severe attack by HIV and AIDS, says Lucas Owuor-Omondi, who works with the Lutheran Communion in Southern Africa's Malaria Programme, a partner of the ELCA Malaria Campaign. HIV and AIDS and poverty work together. HIV and AIDS and malaria are good friends. They destroy and destroy very fast. So in order to fight malaria, Lucas says, it's essential to fight poverty.



In northwestern Zambia, for example, people are engaged in beekeeping but often aren't connected to the marketplace to make money from their harvest. What the program has done is that through introducing the value chain component, they have linked these beekeepers with the appropriate people in the private sector, Lucas shares, and these people have now introduced a different way of keeping the bees in terms of improved beehives, improved harvesting of honey. But what is more important, Lucas continues, is that the program has linked the beekeepers with the market in Lusaka, which is the capital, and already some money has come back and people are already giving testimonies of the kind of difference that this has made in their lives. A similar program in Mozambique is connecting sugarcane farmers with ways to improve harvest and link up with manufacturers who can use the sugarcane in their products.

The idea is that as people are able to make a sustainable living for themselves, they will use their money to not only provide a safer, healthier lifestyle for themselves but also to contribute to improving the community. And perhaps with an improved quality of life, people will have more time to focus on learning more about and actively trying to prevent malaria.

Through the gradual introduction of a high level of awareness, it is actually possible if that is backed up with a capacity to be able to afford that net, Lucas says. Our hidden agenda is that they'll not just buy cars, that they will remember the nets.

However, making plans for our finances and for the care of our children or dependents at the time of our death is so very important. Having control of our own end-of-life arrangements not only ensures that things are done according to our wishes, but can make issues so much easier for family members, too. Written plans also enable us to give to organizations and people who are special to us. Preparing end-of-life documents should be seen as an essential aspect of total stewardship, as it is a final way of taking care of our earthly gifts.

Brian and I started doing more long-term financial planning when we were expecting our oldest child. We had attended adult Sunday school sessions with Pastor Frank and then local Lutheran Planned Giving representative Keith Nelson about end-of-life matters. Keith visited with us in our home to help us prepare for meeting with an attorney to draft a will. We decided to include preambles in our wills that are statements of faith. The toughest issue was determining who would be guardians for our children. There are many decisions to make, and they're not always easy. One subject that we readily agreed on was that a portion of our estate would be given to Augustana College, Sioux Falls; and another to Lord of Love Lutheran Church. Though our daughter was very young at the time, we felt it was a fundamental part of our stewardship to show our heirs that we give something back to God, even in death.



Psalm 25 4-5 (NRSV) Make me to know your ways, O Lord; teach me your paths. Lead me in your truth, and teach me, for you are the God of my salvation;

I do enjoy hearing God's word read each Sunday along with the insight provided by good preaching and teaching. I have read parts of the Bible when participating in study of specific books or topics. And, I do periodically search for Bible verses that address certain issues and questions that are of interest to me or help me prepare for our weekly Sunday school lesson.

I find it fascinating how the sometimes-stodgy language of the Bible is interpreted into words and music of faith, hope, love, prayer, and praise. I am grateful that talented people have been inspired to bring God's word alive to us through music. It makes me a little curious to look up the verses attributed to the hymns and anthems. Maybe I'll use those as another excuse to avoid reading through the Bible.

Isaiah 12:5-6 (NRSV) Sing praises to the Lord, for he has done gloriously; let this be known in all the earth. Shout aloud and sing for joy, O royal Zion, for great in your midst is the Holy One of Israel.

Let us give thanks and praise to God for His blessings and grace for all his people.

Spring Gathering

It was a beautiful spring-like day when 100+ women attended the annual NSWO Metro East Spring Gathering on Saturday, March 9 at St. Paul Lutheran Church in Millard. Attending from Lord of Love were Val Florea and Ruth Manning. The vocal group "Manna," from St. Paul's, led the gathering music.





Bishop Brian Maas' Bible study focused on the theme, "Lift Up Your Hands in Praise." Using the Latin word "orans" which translates into "prayer," he shared several different "orans" postures, or prayer positions. The positions of prayer are a sign of vulnerability or surrender, blessing, welcome, and service. The four gestures Jesus used during the Lord's Supper were taking, blessing, breaking, and eating. Our prayers should be like Jesus on the cross, dying to self.
