Celebrate With Us on Sunday, June 12

Sunday, June 12, is Pentecost Sunday, when Christians celebrate the birth of the Christian church by the power of the Holy Spirit. The disciples were empowered to proclaim the gospel of the risen Christ and began preaching to crowds who were able to understand the message in their own language.



Lord of Love's 39th Anniversary



"The Lord of Love has come to me, I want to pass it on," a line from the song "Pass It On," was the inspiration for the name "Lord of Love." On June 11, Lord of Love celebrates its 39th anniversary. On Sunday June 12, we are going to have an anniversary party for Lord of Love and celebrate all of the work that has made Lord of Love and pray that the Holy Spirit will continue to give us the opportunity to "Pass It On."

Organ Rededication

Last year, we completed a reconditioning of Lord of Love's pipe organ (additional information is provided in the article titled "Lord of Love's Pipe Organ," below). On Sunday, June 12, we will let our pipe organ help us celebrate the power of the Holy Spirit and pray that the Spirit will continue to help us "Pass It On."



Celebration Sunday

Former Lord of Love organist Tim Mix will be with us to help us celebrate Pentecost, Lord of Love's anniversary, and the rededication of the pipe organ. This will be a Sunday of hymns and music. Please plan to come and worship on that Sunday. The events of the day are as follows:

- 8:40 a.m. Special music on the organ and by the Lord of Love Brass
- 9:00 a.m. Worship Service
- 10:00 a.m. Breakfast with Tim Mix discussing the pipe organ and its contribution to our worship services

Lord of Love's Pipe Organ

Last year, we reconditioned Lord of Love's pipe organ. On Sunday, June 12, we are going to celebrate Pentecost Sunday, Lord of Love's anniversary, and the rededication of our pipe organ. Here is some information to help us appreciate the pipe organ.

Type of Organ

Lord of Love's pipe organ was built by Gress-Miles Organ Company of Princeton, New Jersey, in the early 1960s for Our Savior's Lutheran Church on 30th and Izard Streets. The musical style of the instrument is considered German Baroque, meaning that it is well suited to play many Bach organ works, other works from that period, and in general good hymns for singing.

Lord of Love's Pipe Organ, continued

It is a two-manual instrument consisting of 23 ranks, or roughly 1,400 pipes. It has a strong trumpet, solid foundations, a suite of various flute sounds, reed stops, and a few soft strings. The trumpet and foundation pipes are located in the GREAT chamber located above and to the left of the pulpit. The flute sounds, strings, some solo reeds, and chimes are located in the SWELL chamber above the organ console on the right. There are louvered doors for this chamber, which open and shut to allow expressiveness during organ playing.

How the Organ Came to Lord of Love

Our Savior's Lutheran Church purchased the organ for \$24,500 in the early 1960s. When Our Savior's disbanded in 1972, many members of that church helped build Lord of Love, but the organ remained with the new owners of the property of Our Savior's. As Lord of Love's building was nearing completion, the owners of Our Savior's said they would not be using the organ and offered it to Lord of Love for nothing. Lord of Love raised \$5,500 to move it from Our Savior's to Lord of Love. The architect insisted that the organ sit behind the rock wall, which caused tuning problems because of the uneven temperatures.

Maintaining the Organ

In 1979, one of the organ builders, Mr. Edgar Gress, came to Lord of Love to assess the condition of his creation. Upon seeing it, he noted he had learned many things since this organ was built. He offered a suggestion to solve the tuning problems. He suggested moving the instrument above the rock wall and making modifications to the organ console to replace all the stops due to their poor quality.

After \$20,000 was raised to fund the moving of the organ, The Newman Organ Company of Seward, Nebraska, was hired to implement the suggestions of Mr. Gress. From the beginning of June until mid-September 1980, the organ was dismantled, making it unavailable for services. The organ console was taken to Seward for restoration while all the pipes, tables, cables, etc., were carefully laid out on the floors on either side of the sanctuary.

Parish lay persons helped create the look you see today. A parish architect designed the new chambers with the assistance of Mr. Newman. All construction work was performed by volunteers, who worked weekdays and weekends through that summer until the project was completed. A dedication service was held in October 1980.

To keep the organ in good condition and maintain the sound quality of the pipe organ, various repairs and replacement and reconditioning of parts were made in 1991, 2004, and 2011.

Thank you to all who have worked on and cared for this instrument and for your investment in maintaining this organ. Today, Lord of Love has an outstanding instrument that adds to our worship services, serves as a witness to our mission, and lets us Pass It On with beautiful sounds.

May this instrument continue to glorify God with its beautiful sounds.



Summer Breakfasts

This summer, as in years past, breakfast will be served in the fellowship hall on Sunday mornings following worship. - **Ministry Team Directory.** Each Ministry Team is working on its team's Ministry Team Directory. This consists of job descriptions that will help educate members so they can choose areas in which they can give of their time and talents. Our goal is to have the final list assembled by August.
- **Policy Updates.** The Child and Youth Safety Policy is updated and will be implemented with the start of VBS on June 13-17. The updated Building Use Policy will be completed in the very near future.
- **Property Projects.** The council is working diligently to bring the final Proposal for Property Projects together for the Special Congregational Meeting on June 5. The informational meeting on Sunday, May 15 was attended by more than 50 people. Your questions and comments were positive and thoughtful.

COUNCIL REPORT

From the Council President – June 2011 by Brian Lund, Council President

Boy, do I like the Doxology, both its tune and message.

Praise God from whom all blessings flow. Praise Him all creatures here below.

Praise Him above you heavenly hosts. Praise Father, Son, and Holy Ghost.

This hymn is a strong statement of faith. It reminds us of God's faithfulness and graciousness.

And, for me, it sets a basis for good stewardship and my response to His love.

Lord of Love has been blessed the first part of this year with increasing worship attendance and consistent giving to the general fund. Recall that we passed a deficit budget for 2011. General fund receipts are tracking with what we forecast for income, but that still leaves us short a bit each month. Pastoral expenses are trending a bit higher than original budget. We had an extended payout for Pastor Bob's interim service (now totally paid). An adjustment in pension and insurance for Pastor Brad was needed to comply with Nebraska Synod requirements. Through April, we had an approximately \$9,400 deficit. To keep you better informed of church finances, monthly income and expense numbers will be published in *The Love Letter* and one Sunday bulletin each month.

So, what are we going to do about this deficit? The council discussed this at our last meeting. The consensus was to inform the congregation of our situation and to let the Holy Spirit do its work within us. The council will continue to review and restrict spending as appropriate while carrying out the programs and ministry projects of our congregation. We ask that members continue to give and serve faithfully as each responds to God's love. We look forward to an expanded membership that may help us to meet our financial obligations through the remainder of this year and beyond.

The summer months are here. People will be vacationing and taking part in other seasonal activities. It is my hope that you would continue to participate in worship, study, and fellowship throughout the year. Remember that our expenses continue and your regular giving is needed to meet our financial obligations. Thank you for your faithful stewardship.

1 Peter 4: 8-11 (NIV) *Above all, love each other deeply, because love covers over a multitude of sins. Offer hospitality to one another without grumbling. Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms. If anyone speaks, they should do so as one who speaks the very words of God. If anyone serves, they should do so with the strength God provides, so that in all things God may be praised through Jesus Christ. To him be the glory and the power for ever and ever. Amen.*

Saved to Serve Opportunities

Did you know there are more than 11,000 Asians living in the Siouxland area? This is the impetus for the second Saved to Serve opportunity for the Nebraska Synodical Women's Organization (NSWO) from August 19-21 at Dakota City, NE. A Celebration of Cultures is being planned as the centerpiece of that event. Participants will learn about the Asian culture and share life stories with Asian people in the community. There will be demonstrations of making pizza and egg rolls and a time to share games, songs, and dances that are part of our traditions.

We will also serve together by tying Lutheran World Relief quilts and assembling Lutheran World Relief health kits. Pastor Jeff Unga will lead a Bible study exploring justice issues and challenges in the Asian culture, and we will learn how English as a second language is taught.

Cost of the event is \$39, which covers most meals and lodging, which will be at a motel in Sioux City. Registration forms are available at the Information Center in the narthex and are due July 26.

NSWO 10th Biennial Convention

Mark your calendars and plan to attend the convention of the Nebraska Synodical Women's Organization in Kearney from September 23-26, 2011. Several women from Lord of Love are planning to attend. At the June LOL Women's Ministry team meeting, Brenda Thom was selected as our delegate, with Val Florea serving as alternate. LOL Women pays the registration fee and housing for the delegate.

Registration forms will be at the Information Center in the narthex. Early bird registration is due August 19 for \$90. After the August 19 through September 9, registration is \$105. Attendees must make their own hotel reservations at the Kearney Holiday Inn Hotel and Convention Center. The deadline for the convention rate of \$72 plus tax is August 24. Registrations are transferable but not refundable.

Just a reminder that **July 1** is the last date to accept applications for 14 scholarships to the convention. Seven will be awarded to women who are first-time convention attendees, and seven will be awarded to a woman who is 35 years or younger. Each of the seven conferences will be giving one of each scholarship.

July 1 also is the deadline to nominate officers and board members for the 2011-2013 NSWO Board. Nominees are needed for vice president, secretary, treasurer, and representative from each of the seven conferences. Nominees must have agreed to serve before they are nominated. The president is elected by ecclesiastical ballot at the Convention. Gwen Edwards' term as president ends with this convention, and she is not eligible to serve another term. **Both application forms are available at the information center in the narthex.**

LWR Personal Care Kits (formerly called Health Care Kits)

Lutheran World Relief finds itself responding to natural disasters and political conflict flare-ups throughout the world. LOL Women is again responding to that need; we are collecting items for Personal Care Kits.

Items needed (**all items must be new**):

- Light- or medium-weight bath-sized towels (approx. 52" x 27"); dark colors preferred. **No washcloths, please.**
- Bath-sized bars of soap (4 to 5 oz.), any brand, in original wrapping.
- Adult-sized toothbrush in original packaging (no toothpaste). Toothbrushes may be purchased in multi-packs, but an individual toothbrush must be sealed in a business-sized envelope; no plastic bags or wrap.
- Sturdy combs.
- Metal mail clippers, packaging removed.



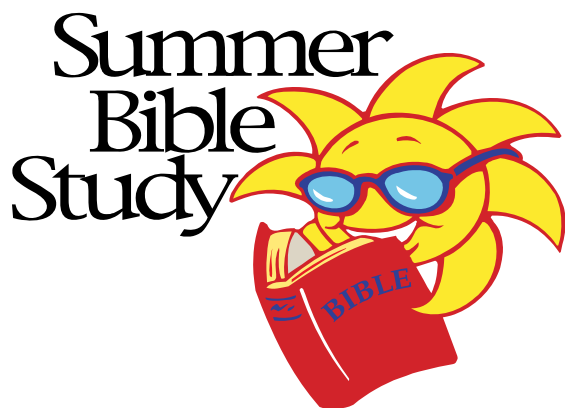

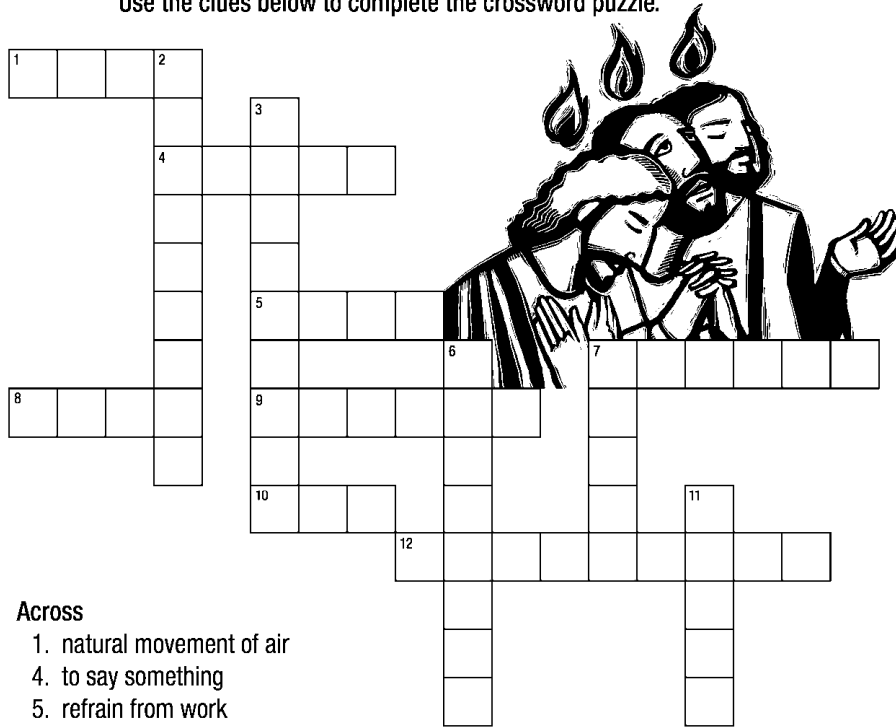

PENTECOST MOBILE

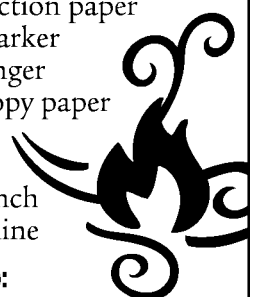
Make this craft as a reminder that God's Holy Spirit is all around you.

What you need:

- Tissue paper (red, yellow, orange), torn into squares
- Plastic transparency
- Craft glue
- Paintbrush
- Construction paper
- Black marker
- Wire hanger
- White copy paper
- Scissors
- Pencil
- Hole punch
- Fishing line

What you do:

1. Overlap tissue squares as "flames" on the transparency.
2. "Paint" glue (thinned with water) over the squares.
3. Fold construction paper in half. Write out Acts 2:4 at the top, by the fold.
4. Poke the hanger through the middle of the fold.
5. On the white paper, write "Holy Spirit" in English, Spanish (*Espiritu Santo*), French (*L'esprit Saint*), etc.
6. Cut out a flame pattern and trace it on the back of the transparency.
7. Cut out flames and glue the "Holy Spirit" names on them.
8. Thread fishing line through a hole atop each flame and tie flames onto the hanger.

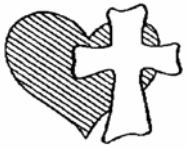

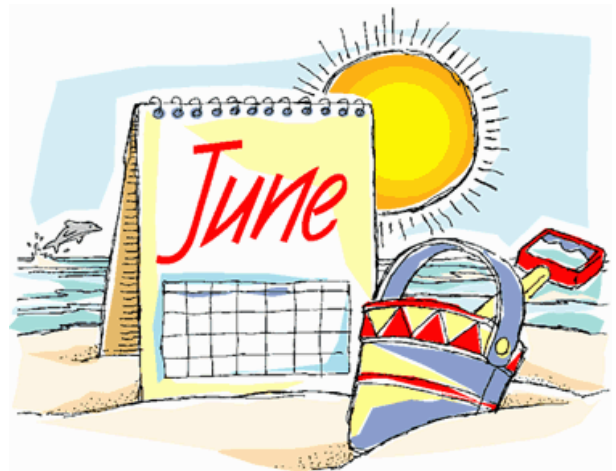
