I know that there were many thanks given to all who planned and put together the entire anniversary weekend, but I want to take this opportunity to thank you again. You did a magnificent job!

Here is Deb’s memory of our 40th Anniversary:

We are most blessed to have such wonderful “kids” of the congregation! All three are most gifted, and each spoke so eloquently of their time at Lord of Love and how it relates to their calling and to worship, service, and community. The whole day and weekend focused on the theme of worship, service, and community. It was great how everything fit together so nicely—even Pastor Brad’s message on Sunday included us being a family and being mission centers rather than “congregations.” We had over 40 members going out to do service at Project Hope, Table Grace, and the ELF Coalition Habitat for Humanity re-hab house. Close to 200 folks worshiped together. The singing was awesome. The bells, brass, organ, piano, and choir were all just wonderful. As Pastor Rebecca said, “we do worship well,” and Saturday’s service was a great example of that. Singing the third verse of “Beautiful Savior” a cappella was a highlight.



There was plenty of food for the throng of folks who stayed to enjoy the fantastic meal, and the noise level was great, as people so enjoyed seeing each other again and getting caught up on their lives—and sharing memories, as well. The program was brief. After thanking all those who enabled us to have such a wonderful day, Harry provided some great memories of our pastors. We sang together again. I believe that I was not alone in being somewhat emotional when singing “Pass it On,” the origin of our congregation’s name. And we all appreciated hearing again the story of how the Luther League at Our Savior’s came up with the name.

2012 Nebraska Synod Assembly Report by Randi VenHuizen and Ruth Manning

A variety of emotions were evident as we arrived Thursday afternoon and registered for the Synod Assembly, two of the 739 registered voters. There was a feeling of camaraderie as we greeted the convention volunteers, those from Lord of Love as well as many of our friends from Nebraska Women of the ELCA, and as we greeted our last interim pastor, Bob Oleson, with his trusty camera equipment around his neck. The hugs and “how are you?” continued as we ran into friends who were delegates to the convention. There was excitement at having Bishop Mark Hanson of the ELCA with us for the entire assembly.

There was a sense of loss as this was the last convention Bishop David deFreese would be chairing. He had chosen not to stand for re-election after serving us for 12 years. It was going to be hard to say goodbye to this much-loved bishop whom we knew as a wonderful Bible study leader, teacher, pastor, and shepherd. But a sense of anticipation surfaced as the candidates for Bishop were introduced on Thursday evening. We were encouraged to continue to pray for discernment and calling of the Bishop of the Nebraska Synod. Bishop Hansen read scripture and prayed before each ballot.

There was music—joyful and beautiful music from the praise bands from various Nebraska Lutheran churches, from the attendees as we worshiped and praised God in music, and by Celia Whittler, our “singer, songwriter, author, speaker, wife, and Mom.” Celia is no stranger to the Nebraska Synod as she has participated in a number of events, including with the Nebraska Youth.

Bethany’s Lutheran Men in Ministry hosted the Thursday evening barbeque before we convened in the sanctuary. After the candidates standing for Bishop gave brief statements, there was a wonderful recognition of Bishop deFreese and his family. The evening consisted of video tributes and testimonies from some who had been touched by his ministry. One of the speakers was Pastor Rebecca (Lund) Sheridan, who spoke on Operation Idea, the innovative program helping young people consider a possible call to the ministry. Capitalizing on the Bishop’s often heard “we do mission,” the We Do Mission Scholarship Fund to help people participate in Synod mission/vision projects was established to honor the deFreeses’ ministry. A preliminary goal of \$30,000 was placed before the assembly; however, the Synod Assembly offering and initial pledges to the fund now total more than \$45,000.

Friday began with worship at 8:00 a.m. followed by the first business meeting and the first ballot for Bishop. Our keynote speaker was Rev. John Nunes, president of Lutheran World Relief (LWR). He shared that our tangible gifts to LWR give a witness to the love of God. He stressed how much the quilts are appreciated by all who receive them. These quilts are often used for coverings for dirt floors for babies to lie on, or as satchels for refugee families to transport all their belongings. Many are used as blankets for HIV/AIDS victims. Nunes also spoke of the LWR program to combat malaria, a disease killing more than one million people yearly. Ruth Henrichs, President/CEO of Lutheran Family Services, spoke briefly about that organization, which will be celebrating 125 years of service on September 16, 2012.

The results of the first ballot were given, and there was no election. Then the stage filled up with dozens of young people dressed in brilliant tie-dyed shirts. This was the summer staff of Nebraska Lutheran Outdoor Ministries, who were then commissioned by the Bishop.

After a delicious boxed lunch, assembly attendees had a choice of participating in 9 workshops or field trips. Since LOL has a history with Cristo Rey Lutheran Church, the Hispanic Lutheran church in South Omaha, both of us chose to go and hear Pastor Liz Connor speak of the church's history and current ministry. We were privileged to hear a man and a woman from that congregation, who only spoke Spanish and whose stories were translated by Pr. Liz, tell of the difference the congregation has made in their lives.


Returning to Bethany Lutheran, we heard an excellent presentation by our keynote speaker. Energetic 78-year-old Phyllis Tickle, religious scholar and author of *The Great Emergence*, stated that we exist in a time of great upheaval. She said the world experiences a transitional cycle every 500 years. It affects the world socially, culturally, and economically as well as affecting religion. The Reformation was part of the last cycle. She said two things happen at the end of each upheaval. First, there is a new emerging church. Second, the old form of religion will not go away, but will "clean up its act."

Following her presentation, the second business meeting was held, and the second ballot for Bishop was cast. We then adjourned for the banquet that was held at Camp Carol Joy Holling. We enjoyed great food served family style—a good way to feed 700+ people. The program was a remembrance of those pastors who have gone to be with the Lord since the last assembly and recognition of the various years of service by our pastors. Lloyd Neve, former member of the LOL brass, was honored for 65 years of ministry.

Saturday began with music and prayer. We held the third business meeting and received the results of the second ballot. Again, no bishop was elected. We then had the general elections for Synod Council and delegates for the 2013 ELCA Churchwide Assembly. Among those elected were our friends, Pastor Rebecca Sheridan and Pastor Linda Walz, former pastor of our congregation.

After the morning break, Bishop deFreese gave his report focusing on twelve statements he has reiterated over the years. He elaborated on these statements:

- Sin is real and it is us.
- Christianity is not a religion of rules but a relationship of response.
- So what?
- Of course, we are to grow spiritually.
- The Bible is not a weapon to be used to hurt people.
- Conflict is inevitable; combat is optional.
- Too many congregations are just country clubs with crosses on top.
- God doesn't call us to be comfortable, but to serve.
- Little moments become big movements with our God.
- We do mission!
- I love the church!
- Together, we live love with the grace and courage of Jesus!

He also emphasized that we need to identify ourselves as MISSION CENTERS rather than congregations because we truly are about mission.

Throughout the business meetings, several resolutions were brought before the Assembly. All were routine, and elicited no discussion before passing. The 2013 budget also was approved.

We welcomed Living Grace Lutheran Church as the newest Mission Center in Nebraska. After lunch, because we still did not have a bishop, a third ballot was cast. Once the results were in, the top three vote getters spoke to the Assembly. On the fourth ballot, Pastor Brian Maas from First Lutheran in Lincoln was elected Bishop. He then spoke to the Assembly, summarizing his comments with: "Everything I have, I will give...the rest God will provide." Pastor Maas will begin his term on September 1 and will be formally installed on September 22 at St. Paul Lutheran Church in Grand Island.

Bishop Mark Hanson spoke next, and he is a powerful speaker. He emphasized expectations and unity in Christ in his presentation. He jokingly said that for some, ELCA stood for "Expectations Low, Climbing Anxiety." He challenged us to be "a church of high expectations, a church rooted in Pentecost." The Assembly closed with a service of Holy Communion, music by a children's choir, and the praise band from Living Grace Lutheran Church.

Some side notes:

Pastor Brad was co-chair of the Assembly, and as you know, he has a great sense of humor. At one point, Bishop Hanson turned to the two of us and said, "Is he always like this?" We affirmed that he was. Later he reported that he had received calls from 42 synods wanting the deFreese/Meyer comedy team at their assemblies.

Gwen Edwards was on the planning team, and we want to acknowledge all of the hard work she gave to this Assembly. We had numerous volunteers from LOL, and we're afraid if we try to name all of them, we would certainly miss someone, so instead, we give a Big THANK YOU to all of you. And last but not least, Aaron Edwards was the crucifer at the closing worship service, sitting between both bishops. We were very proud of him.

And one final thank you to the mission center of Lord of Love, who elected us to be voting members to the Assembly. It was very humbling to be part of the historic occasion of voting for our next Bishop.

I, Ruth, a veteran of several assemblies as a guest or voting member, have never heard so much laughter, nor felt such a spirit of joy at any of the assemblies. God be praised for this blessing.

VBS during Project Embrace at Iglesia Luterana Cristo Rey

Project Embrace, which started in the 1960s, is a summer day-camp program for grade school children at various churches. Most funding is from each individual parish's resources, though some comes from the Nebraska Synod's Metropolitan Ministries. First Lutheran, Augustana Lutheran, and Iglesia Luterana Cristo Rey are the three remaining Mission Centers that continue with an abbreviated program each summer.

A part of Project Embrace at Cristo Rey is Vacation Bible School, led by volunteers from other Mission Centers. Leah Klos was one of the young people helping with VBS at Cristo Rey, and here is her description of our time there.

In the second week of June, for three days, Deb Lund, Carly Rieff, and I got to volunteer at Cristo Rey for vacation bible school. We helped to teach the kids to love each other and their neighbors. One of the stories we read to them was the Good Samaritan. We did some crafts like making love glasses, sang songs, and played games outside that required the kids to work together.

It was a great experience to help teach the kids about God's word and ways to love each other and their neighbors. It was great to get to know each of them and learn some of their stories and just have fun together.




Endowment Committee is Looking at Need Again

The Endowment Committee will be looking at special needs and missions that need funding. The Endowment Committee does not help with the general operating budget items of the church, but with special missions, projects, or one-time awards.

In the past year, the Endowment Committee has awarded \$1,140 for three scholarships to the Nebraska Lutheran Outdoor Ministries, \$500 to replace the roof on the Education wing of the Vocational School at Pastor Anna's Church, and \$1,000 to the ELCA Malaria Campaign. An update on the ELCA Malaria Campaign is provided below.

If you know of a special mission or project that needs funding, obtain an application from the church office, complete the application, and return it to the Endowment Committee before 11:59 p.m. on September 30, 2012.



Although the Endowment Committee invests the fund to enable it to grow, the Endowment Committee needs additional funding so that more can be done. Remembering the Lord of Love Endowment Fund in your estate plan is an easy way to supplement the fund and ensure that your fruits on earth are extended beyond your lifetime. Lord of Love will take contributions to the Endowment Fund at any time. You can put a check in the collection plate stipulating that the amount goes to the Endowment Fund (Please make it a check solely for the Endowment Fund). In addition, if the Lord should bless you with a winning lottery ticket, remember the Endowment Fund as a recipient of your first fruits.

ELCA Malaria Campaign Update

One of the recipients of the 2011 proceeds from the Lord of Love Endowment Fund was the ELCA Malaria Campaign. The ELCA Malaria Campaign works with church companions in 11 countries in Africa that are in need of help to prevent and cure the deadly disease.

Day of Service

Over 40 people participated in service projects on June 9! Thank you to all of the volunteers who made this day of service a success:

- **Habitat for Humanity** – The crew at our ELF Habitat for Humanity Re-hab house served in many ways: framing, rebuilding the porch, repairing the floor, and cleaning up debris. Others prepared and served lunch to the workers at the site.
- **Project Hope** – These workers removed a shelf, painted a hallway, sorted clothing, and organized food products. Project Hope is always in need of canned food, especially canned fruits and vegetables.
- **Table Grace Cafe** – We distributed Table Grace flyers at the Omaha Summer Arts Festival, the Old Market, and the Farmer's Market to foster support. Another crew worked in the kitchen to prepare, serve, and clean up after the Saturday lunch. Table Grace serves noon lunches of gourmet pizza, soup, and salad to anyone, regardless of ability to pay. They offer job training in the food service industry and ask those who cannot pay to work for their meals. People who can pay are encouraged to have lunch there to support their ministry of serving the homeless.



Our year of service has officially begun, with a goal for each of us to volunteer at least 20 hours outside the walls of Lord of Love.

From the Council President – July 2012 by Brian Lund, Council President

Psalm 19:1-2 (NIV) *The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands. Day after day they pour forth speech; night after night they reveal knowledge.*

At our June council meeting, we reviewed how our methods of communication are perceived by our members and related topics. Thank you to all who completed the communications survey prepared by our Outreach ministry team. I came away from our discussion with these key thoughts:



- We do a fair job of communicating most things much of the time. In fact, over 85% of respondents rated our communication as effective.
- Communication is everyone's responsibility. Those who prepare and administer our various methods of communication can only "report" what is provided to them. We need to identify the information to send out, who should receive it, what method to use, and when it is needed.
- Communication takes advanced planning. Effective communication requires a plan of what is happening. We can't communicate things we haven't really figured out yet.
- The church office is a great place to start. Ensure that any meeting or event gets on the church calendar and doesn't conflict with other planned activity. Mary Lou is a great resource for all things church related.
- We need multiple methods of communication. One size doesn't fit all. Some of us are technology savvy, and others may rely on more traditional means.
- We need to look at ways to improve what and how we communicate. This includes increasing awareness of what methods exist, who to contact, information deadlines, and looking for better ways to reach all of our members.




