Reformation Day by Pastor Brad

October welcomes the onset of cool mornings, changing colors of the leaves, pumpkins, and Halloween—but for Lutherans, it also commemorates Reformation Day! Reformation Day marks Martin Luther's public declaration of how the Church might be more than a set of rules and regulations and instead be a place for the spiritual renewal of our souls as we are showered by God's grace.



Martin Luther struggled with the church's teaching that he earned his forgiveness of sin and justification before God through his works as a monk. Instead, he found a greater and deeper understanding that God's grace is what justifies us. In celebration of and in response to the gift of grace, we are then called to live lives of love and perform acts of service.



Martin Luther wanted people to know about the love of Jesus Christ as seen through our actions. Luther said, "Should anyone knock at my heart and say, 'Who lives here?' I should reply, 'Not Martin Luther, but the Lord Jesus Christ."

This is our prayer as well. Our desire should be that anyone who may look upon our hearts would see the heart of Christ.


My greatest pleasure is to see others inside and outside of the church perform great acts of love—not

Mission Possible Update

The Mission Possible Team is working with Bob Kasworm, our missionary in Tanzania, and the Lord of Love Endowment Committee to provide funds for a Tanzanian student, Martha, to attend school to become a teacher. This is a 3-year commitment. As reported in September, special offering funds from Thanksgiving, Advent, and Christmas will go to the Lutheran Family Services At Ease program for military families, and \$500 will be reserved from congregational mission project monies for our Youth Fund. The Mission Possible Team meets later this month to determine other programs to support for the rest of the 2012-2013 program year.

Author to Discuss Big Bang and World Origins in Lincoln October 4-7, 2012

Dr. Karl Giberson, internationally known science-and-religion scholar, will be speaking at Olin B Lecture Hall on the Nebraska Wesleyan University campus (St. Paul Avenue and 50th Street) in Lincoln at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, October 4.

Giberson's presentation is titled, "From Big Bang to Big Brain: A Creation Story for the 21st Century." The lecture, sponsored by a Scientists in Congregations grant to Lincoln's First Lutheran Church (1551 S. 70th Street), is free and open to the public.

Giberson has two new publications introduced this year. The first, *The Wonder of the Universe*, was released in February, and *Seven Glorious Days* was just made available on September 1.

A reception will follow Giberson's October 4 presentation. At 1:00 p.m. on October 5, he will facilitate a discussion at First Lutheran Church. The discussion is expected to conclude by 2:00 p.m. Scholars and all interested parties are welcome to participate in this activity as well as the First Friday Jazz program with Mac McCune that begins at 11:30 a.m. at the church.

As a part of its Science Cafe series, Giberson will lead the adult Sunday School discussion at First Lutheran on Sunday, October 7, at 9:30 a.m. The public is invited to attend. On the preceding Sunday, September 30, Dr. Dean Sieglaff, physics professor at Nebraska Wesleyan University and a leader of the Scientists in Congregations grant project at the church, will discuss Giberson's *The Wonder of the Universe* publication.

Lutheran World Relief Ingathering



Making Lutheran World Relief (LWR) Mission Quilts provides an opportunity for Lutherans in the U.S. to answer God's call to love and serve our neighbors in need. To those that receive the quilts, they are tangible symbols of God's love and compassion.

A continued generous response from congregations in Nebraska will ensure that LWR is able to respond to the increasing needs overseas.

The 2012 Lutheran World Relief Ingathering will be held November 5-9 at various sites throughout Nebraska.

Each year LWR spends nearly \$1.7 million to operate its Quilt and Kit Ministry. Those funds, combined with the generosity of quilters and kit-makers throughout the United States, enable LWR to distribute more than \$12 million worth of Quilts and Kits annually.

Below is the approximate cost to deliver Quilts & Kits:

- One Quilt \$2.25
- One School Kit \$1.40
- One Personal Care Kit \$2.65
- One Baby Care Kit \$1.30
- One Fabric Kit \$1.00
- One 18-Pound Carton of Soap \$11.60

OUTREACH

Syria Conflict Update

The Situation:

Since February 2011, the ongoing conflict in Syria has displaced nearly 2.5 million people. Many have left their homes to take refuge elsewhere within Syria while others are beginning to cross the borders into the neighboring countries of Turkey, Lebanon, Jordan, and Iraq in search of safety and shelter. Those who have fled are finding care in refugee camps while others are staying with host families.



Many of Syria's neighbors have opened their borders to receive the refugees fleeing chaos and danger in their home country. Receiving refugees is difficult work that can stretch resources and affect political dynamics in the host countries. In these difficult times, groups already vulnerable in the region can be at even greater risk.

ELCA Response:

Earlier this year, Presiding Bishop Mark Hanson wrote to Christian church leaders in Syria, offering support for the churches' collective call for an end to violence and his prayers for the people in the region. This reflects our continued commitment to stand with our companions in Syria as we seek ways to encourage their role in the promotion of peace and reconciliation.



ELCA Disaster Response is working with our partners in the region, both within Syria and the surrounding areas. We have already sent \$200,000 to help those who are in need. We have been at work to provide food and items such as hygiene kits, household items, bedding, and clothing. Special care and training in nutritional support for mothers is also being made available. Subsidies for rent, tuition, school fees, and classes have also been made available to help alleviate some of the economic burden faced by displaced families.

We are also at work through The Lutheran World Federation and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land, meeting the needs of Syrian refugees who have traveled to Jordan. Camp management and the provision of access to proper shelter have been the primary focus of our work.

ELCA Disaster Response has committed another \$250,000 to help support housing costs and camp management.

Service Opportunities

Omaha CROP Walk

The annual CROP walk is Sunday, October 14. Lord of Love folks are encouraged to participate by walking and seeking financial gifts or by supporting with their pocketbooks those walking. **CROP Hunger Walks** are community-wide events sponsored by Church World Service and organized by local volunteers to raise funds to end hunger. Monies raised are used to assist with local hunger needs in our community.



For the Omaha CROP Walk on Sunday, October 14:

- 1. Meet at Lord of Love at 1:00 p.m. if carpooling is desired; or meet at 1:30 p.m. at the registration area at First Christian Church, 66th and Dodge, for those wishing to walk as a Lord of Love group. Otherwise, walkers may start as late as 2:30 p.m.
- 2. Organized routes are 1 mile, 2 miles, and 5 miles and begin at First Christian Church.
- Participants need CROP envelopes, which can be obtained from Pastor Brad or Deb Lund, for donations. The yellow copy must be turned in at registration on October 14. Donations and all envelopes (used and unused) must be turned in to the treasurer at First Christian Church on October 14 or to Deb Lund.
- 4. 25% of donations for the Omaha CROP Walk go to Together, Inc. and Food Bank for the Heartland. Organizations supported by The Church World Service include Lutheran World Relief.

Lutheran Pantry

One ongoing service opportunity is working at the Lutheran Pantry at First Lutheran on 31st and Jackson. People are needed especially on Mondays and Tuesdays from about 12:45 to 2:30 p.m. The need is great, as 70 to 100 people have been coming in one and one-half hours on Mondays, for example. - The gift of hope





COUNCIL REPORT

From the Council President - October 2012 by Brian Lund, Council President

Matthew 7:7-8 (NRSV) Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you. For everyone who asks receives, and everyone who searches finds, and for everyone who knocks, the door will be opened.

Our fall programming has started. Deb and I are getting to know some of our young people a little bit better by teaching Junior High Sunday School. We use the Faith Incubators (FINK for short) as a means of supplementing the material that Pastor Brad uses for confirmation. This school year, we plan to cover the Old Testament and New Testament. We will likely include some other subject areas as well. Our intention is to provide the basis of a strong faith life for our youth.



Adults in our congregation come from a variety of faith backgrounds. Deb and I both grew up Lutheran with grandparents and parents who fostered a strong life of faith. I grew up spending some Saturday mornings helping to clean our church building. I am not exactly sure how my dad got that assignment, but I do know that it made me comfortable being in God's house and taking an active part in the care of church property. On Saturday nights, we did our Sunday school lesson, learned our Bible verse, and then took a bath. Every Sunday, we had family devotions before breakfast. Then our family went to church and sat in the same pew, right towards the front on the pulpit side. As children, we learned about God and Jesus in Sunday school. We sang songs that reflected a joyous faith and strong hope in God's promise. How fortunate we were to have had these opportunities to hear God's Word and to receive the seeds of faith.

Some of us at Lord of Love may have a similar faith story. Others have been on a significantly different journey of faith. Regardless of how we got here, we all can share in the joy of having a loving God who forgives our sins and blesses us with His faithful promise of grace.

What are you doing to help strengthen and broaden your own faith? Do you read the Bible or a daily devotion? Do you participate in Bible study? Do you talk with others about how God is present in your life? There are opportunities for study and faith development at Lord of Love. I encourage you to seek these out and to participate so that you can grow in faith and help others to do so also.
