The Power of Prayer! by Pastor Brad

James 5:13-16 speaks of the power of prayer. "Are any among you suffering? They should pray. Are any cheerful? They should sing songs of praise. Are any among you sick? They should call for the elders of the church and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord...."

I've preached about prayer, studied prayer practices, prayed constantly for others, but never experienced prayer in the way that I did before my surgery!

As Heidi and I arrived in the parking lot of the Midwest Neurological Surgical Hospital in anticipation of my morning surgery, some "familiar faces" were seen milling around. A couple of people stood around talking outside their car and a few others exchanged conversation through car windows.

The "familiar faces" were members of Lord of Love who—unbeknownst to me—were gathering to pray with us before I checked in for surgery. As this loving group gathered around, first in conversation about what the day would hold and enjoying the crisp fall morning, another close friend of mine arrived to join in the circle of prayer.

As check-in time approached, we gathered closer, hand-in-hand, arms around shoulders, and I was showered with one of the most powerful experiences of prayer that I have ever been blessed with. Words of care and concern for my physical healing, guidance for the surgeon's hands and medical team, support for of my family, all spoken with deep faith and trust toward a God who loves and protects us.

I was overwhelmed by the extreme gesture of love from this group and by the knowledge of many, many others from Lord of Love and elsewhere who were lifting me in prayer. I thank you! Walking into the hospital, I didn't feel like it was just Heidi and me; rather we were being accompanied, held up, and carried by the presence of God and others. Throughout that morning, and definitely since then, I've reflected on how blessed WE, the church, is that one can approach surgery, difficult life struggles, losses and blessings with the support of prayer and a loving community of faith.

Prayer is powerful! In a season of Thanksgiving, I give thanks for the community of Lord of Love, and for the church of Christ, and for the promise from God that tells us that we are never alone. We find comfort and hope in the knowledge that we are surrounded by God's presence and by the prayers of others.

Know that you are all in my prayers as we walk together on this journey called "life."

The Faith Journey of Paul Kroll

When I first thought of asking Lord of Love members to tell their faith stories, I thought of Ann Kroll. She not only agreed to do so...she offered to write it. A couple of weeks ago, I received her husband Paul's faith story in my mailbox, which not only surprised me but encouraged me. I shouldn't have been surprised because Ann and Paul have been involved in our church's activities since they first walked through our doors in June 2008. They made friends quickly and have helped out wherever they see the need. Marilyn Thomsen and I, among others, can certainly attest to that.

Paul taught Luther Kids last year with Ann, but this year during that time he is taking a Language Interpretation for Medicine class. Ann is teaching Luther Kids this year. They both do altar care; Paul attends the men's group, and he is on the Stewardship committee and the Endowment committee.

Paul tutors in the Math Department at Metropolitan Community College. His past careers have been in insurance auditing and tax preparation. He also speaks Spanish and does translating.

We are fortunate to have Ann and Paul in our church family. Here is Paul's story.

My faith journey started when I was born. I was raised in the United Church of Christ. I attended Sunday school every Sunday. My friends attended Sunday school with me.

After confirmation, most of my peers did not come to church. I liked church much more than high school. In church, I was treated more as an adult. High school was a very artificial society. After you leave high school, the cheerleaders, football players, student council presidents, and proms all fade away.

The one problem that remained was, "Who was God?" and "Who was Jesus?" Christianity was treated as an academic subject among my peers. We heard choice scripture every Sunday. The sermons were written in the famous onion style. There were three stories that went with the scripture. The first two would be partially explained, then the third story was completed, then the second would be completed, and then the first. This often explained what Jesus wanted, but it did not fully answer the question.

I attended college at Kansas Wesleyan. The students there said that they believed in God and the Bible; however, the ideas from church became mixed with other ideas, such as: Vegetarianism was God's will. Sexual relations were the answers to all ills. Watergate had been resolved and the Vietnam War was over. The opposition from these events was supposed to generate love and understanding instead of hate. It actually generated hypocrisy.

Early in the year 1976, I gave up with the snubs and retaliations that went on in the student body. I knew that the teachings of Jesus were true and right; I gave myself up to him. The one question that remained was, "What all did Jesus teach?"

That summer I went to Quito, Ecuador, to study Spanish. I had been in Spanish-speaking countries before, and I knew to bring reading material. I brought thirteen books consisting of novels, archeological books, and psychological books. I also brought an outreach version of the New Te stament. As outreach version is a paperback with nothing more than the actual Bible, no extra notes or explanations.

After reading the other twelve books, I read the New Testament from Matthew to Revelations, in order. All the choice scriptures were in order. I read all four Gospels, then the complete Acts of the Apostles. I read everything in the Pauline letters. I then read the remaining letters and books. What Christ wanted and expected of us became clearer. I did not need those little extra notes from the study Bible. It is amazing how society has not changed in two thousand years. All the philosophical solutions were not new.



I have tried to live my life with what Jesus taught in the Bible and to remove all these other extra outside beliefs, new age thinking and various modern day rationalizations of what Christianity encompasses. I understand some of the outside ideas, and some are useful, but I keep the teaching of Christ first before all other ideas.

Mission Possible Update

The Mission Possible Team will soon meet to review the surveys regarding choices for funding and to determine where our mission dollars should be spent for the rest of 2011 and into 2012. As you should know, 2.5 percent of our income goes to outreach mission projects, above and beyond the amount given to the Nebraska Synod for our mission share. The primary task of the Mission Possible Team is to explore, research, and decide where those monies should go each year. In addition, the Mission Possible Team assigns the recipients of all special offerings—Thanksgiving, Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter, and summer breakfasts.

Mrs. Maimu is found!

We are thrilled to report that thanks to special efforts by Rev. Martin Russell (Nebraska Synod Assistant to the Bishop) and our own Bob Kasworm, there has been contact and a response from Mrs. Elisante Maimu. As of this writing, we are in the process of transferring funds through Bob Kasworm to Mrs. Maimu for her sons' education. The following is summarized from an email from Bob Kasworm:

Mrs. Sara Elisante Maimu is 57 years old and seems very nice. Her first son is Elihuruma, age 21. He is studying for a BA in Education (Language and Management) at Mzumbae University in Morogoro Tanzania. Her second son is Peter, age 14, who is in form 1 (9th grade) at Boloti secondary school.

I explained that LOL had taken a special offering for the support of her and the kids after we received word of Pastor Maimu's death. She clearly was touched by this and said it would mean a lot as she is sending the kids to school and building a house. I asked her if she had any plans to go into the ministry since we knew she had studied theology but never had been ordained. She said she planned to speak to the Bishop, and it would be up to him.

She said this was clearly the plan of God, and she read the following Bible passage in Swahili to share with Lord of Love (she pulled an obviously well worn bible out of her bag): Hebrews 6:10 "God is not unfair. He will not forget the work you did or the love you showed for him in the help you gave and are still giving to your fellow Christians."

Nebraska Synod "We Do Mission" Field Trip 2011

More than 50 people from the Nebraska Synod served in the community of Lexington during Field Trip 2011 in October. The group built bunk beds for 26 children of families in need, painted a local apartment complex that is home to newcomers, and visited local schools. The group also learned more about the nation's complicated immigration system and its flaws through the Welcome Center, a Mission Field Nebraska ministry run by Lutheran Family Services.



Nebraska Synod Joins Texas Hay Lift Effort

The drought and wildfires across Texas this year have destroyed hay crops used to feed livestock. With no feed available for purchase, many farmers and ranchers in the state are selling their cattle out of desperation.



Following the lead of other synods, Nebraska Synod farmers and mission centers have stepped forward to donate hay that will be transported to Texas ranchers in need.

Mission centers in Albion, Auburn, Falls City, Verdon, Scribner, Talmage, and Uehling, as well as the entire Prairie Cluster are sending 10 truckloads of hay south to help feed livestock through the winter in the affected areas.

Mission Centers "Do Mission" at Fall Doings

This fall, Nebraska Synod mission centers have been doing mission for campus ministry and prison ministry at their cluster Fall Doings.

Campus ministry and prison ministry are both among the many outreach programs we share and support through our work and our mission share dollars. Fall Doings participants throughout the state not only spent time learning about these vital ministries, but also prepared care kits for college students and ex-offenders reentering society.



At the Northeast Cluster Fall Doing, 67 people attended and prepared 58 care kits for prison ministry.

COUNCIL REPORT

From the Council President – November 2011 by Brian Lund, Council President

1 Corinthians 4:1-2 (ESV) This is how one should regard us, as servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God. Moreover, it is required of stewards that they be found trustworthy.

This past month of October, we celebrated a new beginning of stewardship. As in other years, members were asked to make a financial commitment to support the 2012 ministries of our

congregation. This year, we were asked to consider this a beginning of an emphasis on stewardship. To me, this means evaluating how we reflect our Christian faith in the use of our time, physical and mental abilities, and financial resources.





The church council has a large stewardship role each year. We care for the wellbeing of our staff and members. We work with others to repair and improve our church property. We focus on the details of the ministries of our congregation and engage our members to support those ministries. We manage expenses to the planned budget and adjust our spending in response to the financial giving of our members and the needs of our congregation.

Monthly financial reporting helps the church council to manage to the budget. These reports are not always easily understood. My assessment is that Lord of Love is financially healthy. Our current year income is slightly ahead of budget, but so is our expense. You may recall that we passed a \$22,000 deficit budget for 2011. At the end of September, our current year budget deficit was about \$7,500. The General Fund, our available cash, has a current deficit of \$17,000. This is our current year deficit plus about \$9,500 deficit carried over from last year. The shortfall could easily be eliminated by a second-mile gift of an additional \$150 to \$250 from each giving unit.

Our capital campaign has been very successful. Our members have responded generously to our property project needs. Because of this, we know that not all of our members can respond to the existing deficit with additional second-mile giving. The Executive committee is currently reviewing options to address a portion of the current deficit through other means. I intend to report on those options at the Annual Meeting on November 13.

Matthew 6:25-26, 33 (NIV) Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food and the body more than clothes? Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.

I am thankful for our members and their faithful sharing of time, abilities, and financial resources in support of Lord of Love and its ministries. Please continue to pray for Lord of Love, Pastor Brad, our ministry together, and for all those in need.
