
Pastor's Page, by Pastor Brad Meyer

I was shopping in a discount store the other day and noticed all of the brand new school supplies displayed for parents and children to purchase for the start of school. There were unsharpened pencils, pink erasers, and crisp white three-holed paper waiting to be bought. I noticed a few families picking out what would be needed for school and how excited they were. For me, it brought back feelings that no matter how new the stuff looked, I still disliked the beginning of school.

As a child, the beginning of school only meant the end of summer and returning to the daily schedule of going to class rather than playing down the street with my friends or going on a family vacation. It meant more reading, studying geography, and my least favorite: MATH! It meant the return of HOMEWORK!

Homework was that nightly chore of endless math problems to solve and lengthy book reports to write. Having to sit down long enough to accomplish the task was hard because there were so many other distractions.

Now – years later – I think there are even more distractions than ever before. This time it isn't pulling me away from homework, but rather from finding time to spend with God. Sometimes I think we look at spending time with God like I looked at my math homework. It was painful took way too much time, and there were so many other things I could be doing.



But if I didn't do my math homework, I certainly wouldn't learn it. It's the same with spending time with God. If we don't spend concentrated time with God – we don't learn about God and our relationship with God doesn't get any closer.

So maybe this year as I watch parents buy new school supplies and children going back to school for a new year, I can look at it as an opportunity to renew the time that I spend with God. Not by seeing it as dreaded homework, but rather as an opportunity to learn more about my ongoing relationship with God.

It's a reminder that we take Jesus with us wherever we go.


Summer Music: Last Chance to Sign Up!

Sunday School Planning

Sunday School starts on Kick Off Sunday, **Sept. 7**. A small group met to review the goals and curriculum for Sunday school, based on the Lord of Love mission statement: "Celebrating and Sharing God's Love in a welcoming community of faith, while serving others."

There will be a new curriculum this year. The program is still "Spark," through the publisher "Spark." All lessons are based on the lectionary. Each grade level is the same topic, but with age-appropriate activities. This way, if a family has children in different grades, the family will have the same topic to discuss with all of their children.

Pastor Brad and Heather Christensen will conduct one Faith Formation Class for each level with parents and children from every grade.

Pr-K will remain the same program, but the skill to develop is to participate and learn to listen. The Faith Formation is "Baptism: Child of God." The concept is "God Loves You, Jesus Loves You, and Jesus is God's Son."

Grades K-4 will use the Whirl program.

Grades K-2: the Skill is to learn to pray. The Faith Formation is "Praying 101"; family, table and bedtime prayers will be shared. The Concept is "Lord's Prayer, How to pray and for whom, when and what to pray for and about"

Grade 3: the Skill is to memorize books of the Bible. The Faith Formation is "Bible 101". The Concept is "Faith: What I Believe". Third graders will receive their own Bibles to use.

Grade 4: the Skill is to memorize books of the

Bible. The Faith Formation is "Baptism 101" The Concept is again: "Faith: What I Believe."

Grades 5 and 6: the Skill is to memorize scripture. The Faith Formation for 5th grade is "Communion 101" and for 6th grade the Faith formation is "The Apostle's Creed 101" or "Luther's Small Catechism 101." The Concept for both grades is Salvation and Grace. Fifth and 6th grade will use "Connect" from "Spark.

Junior High will continue to use "Faith Incubator" and will attend Confirmation Class.

Senior High will continue to discuss ways to manifest their faith in school, as jobs and as they go about their days.



Adult Education will have a variety of topics. Heather Christensen will teach the congregation about "Safe Guarding God's Children". Other topics will be discussed, so look for information in the bulletin for details.

A parent meeting will be held in late August with parents of Sunday School youth to review the curriculum. There is a cost of \$10 for the handouts. Parents will be asked to contribute \$5 per child if able to help defray the cost of the program.


Youth Group to Meet on Wednesday Evenings

Transforming Life and Faith Bible Study

A new life partner, a new child, a new job, a new home: most of us recognize how our lives are changed by these experiences. In *Transforming Life and Faith*, we will consider how our lives and faith journeys are transformed by the events we experience and the people we meet.

In both the Old and New Testament, and especially in Acts of the Apostle, we will read about people who have life-changing experiences: Paul on the road to Damascus, Moses in the wilderness of Midian, Lydia praying by a river in Macedonia, an Ethiopian man traveling from Jerusalem to Gaza. We will watch them turn to God as their minds, hearts and daily lives are altered. We will reflect on the ways we, too, have been and will be transformed and called by God to serve His mission in the World.

The author of the study is Carol Schersten LaHurd, a lifelong teacher: Red Cross swimming lessons, high school English, parish education, and, for the past 30 years, biblical studies, Islam, and interfaith relations in colleges, seminaries, the church and wider community. After earning degrees from Augustana College (Illinois) and the University of Chicago, she received a Ph.D. in New Testament from the University of Pittsburgh and Pittsburgh Theological Seminary.


