Pray for Peace by Pastor Brad Meyer

In recent days, several news stories have tragically reported people being randomly shot or targeted by acts of violence in Omaha and other cities across the country. It troubles my heart to hear about a young child being killed by a stray bullet while innocently eating breakfast at the kitchen table or others being gunned down while simply shopping in a grocery store or waiting to start their school day.

I have a difficult time understanding how, in many situations, humanity has lost an ability to find peaceful solutions by talking through a situation rather than reverting to acts of violence. Some may struggle with emotional and mental issues that cause them to act in violent ways while others have been raised in unhealthy systems that include violence. No matter the situation, we pray for solutions.



I'm not writing this reflection trying to solve the problem for which there is no simple solution but rather to express that just as we are upset and saddened about this human condition that plagues us, so is God.

God's desire for us is to show compassion for one another. God's hope for us is that we not follow or get caught up in the things of this world, but rather do the things of God by showing love and forgiveness. As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. Colossians 3:12-13

We are in the midst of the season of Epiphany, when Jesus is revealed to us as the Son of God, the Light of the World, the Bringer of Peace. Jesus modeled for us compassion, love, and forgiveness, and Paul wrote about clothing ourselves with these attributes. This means that in all areas of life, we are to imitate the characteristics of Christ.

My prayer is that we don't miss the opportunity to share these attributes in all circumstances of our life and that we boldly proclaim the desire for peace.

We had the opportunity to go to Sunridge Village Retirement Community and clean their parking garage as well as sanitize hand railings and door knobs throughout the facility. We visited with several residents and

made a new friend in resident Millie. The youth really enjoyed this opportunity. They saw how their efforts could positively impact others and how it made them feel good about how they spent their time.

Other activities included workshops focusing on the three parts of the theme. Do (Justice) workshops included guest speakers from Mosaic and Table Grace Café, and synod missionaries Erin and Josh Branchaud in Grand Bourg, Argentina, via Skype.

Love (Kindness) workshops challenged us to consider how we can love others and in turn ourselves by standing up for each other, by filling another's bucket, by being the friend to the new kid. A poignant example of a clementine was used: we each carefully observed a clementine, noticing all the things that made our own clementine different and identifiable, but when we peeled the clementine and put them all in a basket, they became more difficult to distinguish...because we are all very similar on the inside, and we are ALL children of God and loved by God regardless of our differences. We are all the same and are called to love one another.

Walk (humbly with God) activities showed us that we can't always do things by ourselves. We need others. And we don't do things for others to receive the glory or recognition. Walking humbly is doing the right thing because it is right and not because of what we receive.

We were able to worship at Resurrection Lutheran in Gretna. While it was interesting to experience a contemporary worship service, it was interesting to hear the youth's impressions. A few liked the band and

the screens that displayed all of the music and prayers. Others missed seeing people they knew and being welcomed; they missed their church family!

We had fun, too! The YMCA hosted our group swimming, and we were showing our dance moves (or lack of) at the dance party. I think we will all remember the sing-along in the van, with all 14 of us in one vehicle singing our hearts out to the radio.

Throughout this winter season, the need for pantry items is constant, so thanks in advance for your generosity in helping those who need food. Table Grace Café continues to feed lunches to many people who are in need. They also provide a music ministry and train some who are interested in restaurant work.





More full-paying customers are needed to provide funds to serve the majority who cannot pay what the lunches cost. So, in addition to giving generously, consider going out for a delicious lunch at Table Grace Café, 1611 ½ Farnam, which is open Monday through Saturday from 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.



Another way we help the hungry is by routinely collecting food and clothing items for **Project Hope** (in the Information Center in the Narthex). Thanks to Gary Ramsay, who delivers the items regularly. In addition, thanks to those who work so very hard in our community garden. We provide many pounds of fresh vegetables to the pantries at Project Hope and First Lutheran Church and to Table Grace Café throughout the growing season. The pantry items and garden produce are visible signs of love for others.

Summer breakfast monies will go to **Lutheran Family Services' Centers for Healthy Families**, particularly for play therapy programs for young children.


