Concentrated Time with God by Pastor Brad

Psalm 138 sings: I give you thanks, O Lord, with my whole heart; before the gods I sing your praise; I bow down toward your holy temple and give thanks to your name for your steadfast love and your faithfulness; for you have exalted your name and your word above everything. On the day I called, you answered me, you increased my strength of soul.

These reassuring verses of Psalm 138 express an individual thanksgiving to God for hearing us and for giving strength to our souls.

It is so easy to become overwhelmed in the midst of life as we come up against numerous struggles with heath issues, employment problems, family circumstances, or sometimes just handling the everyday issue of never having enough time to get everything done. We can find ourselves spending more time worrying about the smaller issues of life and less time focusing on the blessings that God has given us or how closely God is walking with us through life.

I recently asked a group that has embarked on a spiritual journey together, "How much <u>concentrated</u> time do you spend each day with God?" The answers varied widely between thirty minutes to not much at all. The question wasn't to impose guilt, but to draw attention to the fact that building a relationship with God takes effort.

Compare our relationship with God to those of our friends. Our relationship with others grows deeper as we learn more about each other, spend time together, and experience life together. The relationship becomes closer and increasingly significant when we discover more and more about one another. The same is in our relationship with God. Our relationship gains depth when we spend focused time with God though personal devotion, worship, and prayer. With this depth of relationship, we are in tune with God's presence and readily find opportunities to give thanks through prayer, worship, and service. Corporately, we gather each week to praise and thank God for his faithfulness and to hear how God is alive and active in our daily lives. We then take that corporate time into our week to remind us to stay focused on God's presence to find strength for our souls.

I encourage you to make <u>concentrated</u> time to nurture your relationship with God, to daily sing God's praises for his faithfulness in your life, and to feel your soul being nourished.

- Find a place to "be still" and listen for God's presence.
- Read a passage of Scripture and see how it speaks to you.
- Write down ways in which you have seen God's presence around you.

Enjoy being in God's presence, and let the smaller things in life take care of themselves.

Mission Possible Update

Thanks so much to everyone for the generous support of the **ELCA Malaria Campaign** this summer through your generous gifts for our summer breakfasts. Special thanks to everyone who prepared, served, and cleaned up, too. Over \$2,000 will be given to this worthy cause.

Lord of Love's garden produced a bountiful harvest this season. Thanks to everyone who tilled, planted, weeded, watered, and gleaned the nutritious vegetables. Thanks, too, to Gary Ramsay and Doug Roberts for the faithful delivery of the produce to the Lutheran pantries at Project Hope, First Lutheran, and Table Grace Café.

Thanks to everyone who participated in some way in the special **food drive for Project Hope** on Sunday, September 8. As you may know, we surpassed our goal of 2,500 nonperishable food items, plus we bagged and gave away 199 4-cup-sized bags of rice. What an awesome example of God's Work. Our Hands!

The Mission Possible team has designated gifts for the remainder of 2013:

- Pastor Anna's School in Tanzania will receive \$1,000 from Congregational Mission Project funds towards the \$1,600 estimated cost of electrical work.
- **ELCA Disaster Response** will receive \$500 from Congregational Mission Project funds for a specific need this fall. (Perhaps the flooding in Colorado?)
- The proceeds from special offerings for Thanksgiving, Advent, and Christmas, along with \$500 from Congregational Mission Project funds, will go to the Sienna Francis House.
- \$250 from Congregational Mission Project funds will go to ELCA for programs dealing with human trafficking.
- The remaining two-thirds of Congregational Mission Project funds, estimated at \$3,500 to \$4,000, will go to our Nebraska ELCA Lutheran Family Services for programs dealing with domestic violence and abuse.

Endowment Committee is Looking at Needs Again by Paul Kroll, Endowment Committee Chair

The Endowment Committee is again looking for special needs and missions that need funding. Applications will be taken until the stroke of midnight on December 1. The Endowment Committee helps fund special missions and projects, and gives one-time awards for good causes. It does not help with the general operating budget items of the church. To receive support for a special need or mission, apply for funds by completing an application obtained from the church office or in the narthex, and return it to the Endowment Committee via the church office.



In the past year, the Endowment Committee has awarded \$1,500 for Martha Mkombo's education at a teacher's college in Tanzania, \$500 for Camp Carol Joy Holling, \$675 for A Place at the Table Food Backpack Program, \$675 for the Lutheran Family Services Boutique Store, \$675 for the NLOM Western Town, and \$455 to the ELCA Malaria Campaign.

Furthermore, the Endowment Committee needs additional funding so that more can be done. Remembering the Lord of Love Endowment Fund in your estate plan is an easy way to supplement the fund and assure that your fruits on earth are extended beyond your life time. Lord of Love will take contributions to the Endowment Fund at any time. Simply put a check in the offering plate stipulating that the amount goes to the Endowment Fund; please make it a check solely for the Endowment Fund.

From the Council President - October 2013 by Brian Lund, Council President

Lord of Love Mission Statement: Celebrating and sharing God's love in a welcoming community of faith, while serving others.

This past month, the congregation council has been working on our 2014 budget. I would like to share a little insight into how that process works and one key budget change for the coming year.

We look at the budgeting process as not just an exercise in balancing projected income to planned expense, but as a reflection of the values and priorities of our congregation. We discuss many ideas, hopes, and concerns throughout the process, but we are continually drawn back to our mission and purpose as the church.



We forecast next year's income by reviewing prior year giving trends, attendance numbers, and changes in membership. Each committee reviews its portion of the expense budget in relationship to prior year and current year spending and the ministry program plans for the coming year. At our September council meeting, we jointly review the consolidated budgeted expenses against projected income. Finally, we make additional budget adjustments to arrive at the budget we propose to the congregation.

This year, we took a harder look at our support of mission through general fund income and the response of our members to our special mission. Recent years have seen a significant increase in giving to seasonal offerings (Lent, Easter, Thanksgiving, Advent, Christmas, and summer breakfast) when they are associated with specific missions. Member response to mission has been outstanding! For these reasons, we are choosing to remove congregation mission projects as a portion of our general fund expense. Our mission support continues through the Nebraska Synod share of 10% of general fund income.
