Tape Ministry: Getting to Know Evelyn Sacrider by Karen Pickens and Rachel Novak

The table was set with colorful Fiestaware and homemade cookies when Rachel and I came into Evelyn's cheerful kitchen to write her life story. Evelyn has a wonderful memory and remembers, in detail, every year and every event regarding her life, especially those that involve her children.

Godfred and Cristine Johns were nine and three when their parents (Evelyn's grandparents) migrated from Russia. Their families didn't even know each other, and Evelyn has no idea how her mother and father met because they settled in different places in the United States. Her father's family settled in Lincoln, Nebraska; her grandfather worked for the railroad. Her mother's family settled in Segwich, Colorado; they were beet farmers. Eventually, both families ended up in Lincoln. Though they all came from Russia, they are actually German, coming from a little town in Germany that was gobbled up by Russia.

Evelyn was born on January 4, 1927; she had an older brother, a younger brother, and two younger sisters. Her father worked for a florist doing potting and planting. Her mother both cleaned houses and did catering to bring in extra money. When the depression came along, her dad lost his job as people needed to spend their money on food instead of flowers and plants. He took his entire family to Wisconsin hoping to find employment, but that didn't happen, so they all came back to Lincoln where he got a job managing a beer tavern. Her mom also needed to work outside the home. Her dad left at 7:00 in the morning, came home for a little nap, and then went back to work. Her mom left at noon. Both parents came home at midnight. Evelyn took over being the Mom in 6th grade. She went to school, came home and fixed dinner, checked her siblings' homework, and got their school clothes ready for the next day. On Saturdays, she did the family wash and she did the ironing. There was no time for play for Evelyn. When asked if she resented having to be the mother at such a young age, she answered that it never occurred to her to be resentful. She just did what was expected of her.

Evelyn attended Whittier School in Lincoln for 7th through 9th grades, and she started Lincoln High School in 10th grade. In the summer, she and her friend heard that Glove Laundry was hiring, so they applied for jobs and they got them. For the first time, she had money, which competed with 11th grade and won. Her next job was at Granger Brothers in the warehouse and then in the coffee department, which paid \$16.00 a week. Out of that money came \$10.00 for room and board at home. After one year in the coffee department, Mr. Granger asked her to work in the fruit department, where she gave orders to the warehouse men and routed the trucks for delivery...even more money! Evelyn apparently didn't suffer from not finishing her education. Her work ethics followed her throughout her life; whenever she could, she helped out financially.

At the age of 19, Evelyn met Frank. Frank was the son of neighbors from across the street and had just returned home from the military. The year was 1945. They started dating in January of 1946 and on June 16, 1946, they were married. They had to hoard sugar to take to the bakery for their small wedding cake. Frank, born on September 29, 1922, was somewhat older than Evelyn...he always said that he took her out of the cradle so that he could raise her right. He learned to be an electrician under the G.I. Bill, and he worked as an electrician in Lincoln until he was offered a job with Union Pacific Railroad.

Evelyn and Frank have four children: Cheryl, Patricia, Michael, and Mary. They were all born within six years. After Cheryl was born, Evelyn and Frank found a house in College View on Calvert Street in Lincoln but had to borrow the principle and the down payment. Frank was concerned about this kind of debt and asked the question as to what would happen should he become sick. He was told, "anybody who owes this kind of money can't afford to be sick." Evelyn again came to the rescue. Frank's Mom took care of Cheryl

while Evelyn worked at Elgin Watch Company. She worked there for six months, saving all of her paychecks. When she quit to have Patricia, she paid off the down payment and had enough left over to buy a Singer sewing machine. Frank's job at Union Pacific took him out of the home from Monday morning until Friday evening, leaving Evelyn to care for the house and the children. Right after Mary was born, Frank was transferred to Omaha. They lived in a rented house and later bought a house on 41st and Wakely. Besides her own four children, Evelyn took care of three additional children for \$25.00 a month.

Life was very busy when the children became teenagers. All were at different schools, and all were very involved in various sports and activities. Evelyn and Frank went to all of their games and events, sometimes having to go separately. Cheryl was the first to graduate and the first to marry. Evelyn had gone to work for Kaufman's Bakery, working from noon to 6:00 p.m., when Mary went into 1st grade. Evelyn asked for time off prior to the wedding. It was Christmas, and there were many cookies to be boxed up for the holidays. Mr. Kaufman said no to time off, so Evelyn said goodbye to Kaufman's. She was a loyal worker and always willing to help out with finances, but not at the expense of her first priority...her children. All four children's wedding receptions were held at home, with Evelyn doing all of the food preparation. Frank also had his priorities, which included just one request of his children, and that was that they would wait until they were twenty-one to marry. They all honored his wishes, although most of them waited only a few days.

Cheryl became a full-time homemaker caring for twins, but later in life, she worked for Pan American Airlines. Patty became a nurse; she and her husband have two children. Michael got appointed to the Air Force Academy and made the Air Force his career; he and his wife have two children. Mary worked for the World Herald after graduation but eventually followed in her grandfather's footsteps as a florist; she and her husband have two children. Evelyn and Frank have seven great-grandchildren. Evelyn continued to work outside of the home after her children had families of their own, but she made sure of one thing. She had always said that if her children ever had children, she would take them one day a week, and she did. She gave them something she had never had.

Evelyn and Frank came to Lord of Love after being members of Shepherd of the Hills for many years. In 1970, just short of their 25th wedding anniversary, they built a house in the Mockingbird addition and didn't want to go so far to church. Ed Guthrie was of friend of Frank, and he invited them to come to Lord of Love. They found the church to be friendly with a lot of nice people, so they joined. Evelyn came to quilting on Tuesdays for a long time, but her poor eyesight has put an end to that. However, she rarely misses Thursday morning Bible Study with her good friends, and she regularly attends worship at 8:00 a.m.

Evelyn says that she wouldn't give a plug nickel to live her life over, but she wouldn't take a million dollars to change a day of it. It has been a wonderful life, and she has learned from all of her experiences, both good and bad. She and Frank have traveled both within and outside of the United States. They have attended all of the important events of their children's, their grandchildren's, and their great-grandchildren's lives. They even took up farming for awhile (in Florence), which was Frank's dream. What he didn't count on was falling from a power poll while working for the railroad and crushing his right knee. Evelyn became the farmer, growing every vegetable imaginable. The benefits of country life, such as delicious fresh food, were short lived and Frank's days at the railroad became numbered. He no longer felt like he was carrying his share of the work, so he retired in September 1983. That allowed them to spend some winters in Texas, where Frank got to fish. Evelyn even tried her hand at fishing. One afternoon, Frank got her all set up then went down the lake a ways to tend to his own fishing line. He told Evelyn to yell "yoo-hoo" if she

felt a fish on her line. It wasn't long before Evelyn was yelling "yoo-hoo." Frank came running. After six more "yoo-hoos," Evelyn decided she had had enough fun and went inside. The last motor trip they took was in 1985, and it lasted one month. After that, Evelyn was ready to come home and stay home.

Frank died on June 8, 2008, after asking his children to promise they would take care of their mom. They have kept that promise. The last time we visited Evelyn, her son-in-law had taken her shopping to buy a new washer and dryer. While she was at it, she bought a new storm door. She was looking forward to having lunch the next day with her daughter and her granddaughter from Kearney. Mary, being a nurse, came by daily after Evelyn's recent fall to tend to her cuts and bruises. Her phone rang each time we were there; calls from her children checking up on her. Evelyn is on the mend now and has been given permission to drive again. She enjoys her life in her comfortable condo, the one that she and Frank bought in 2000, and she plans on staying right there as long as she lives. She is an avid Nebraska Football fan, she enjoys baking and taking cookies to her neighbors and her favorite meal is pot roast, which she learned to cook on top of the stove because her very first oven was too tiny to hold a roast. She shared her recipe with us, and if you like, I am sure that she will share it with you.

Rachel and I have loved getting to know Evelyn Sacrider, and we are so thankful to have her in our Lord of Love church family.

Mission Update: ELCA Global Barnyard by Deb Lund

Are you thinking about your Christmas list and what to get that certain someone who has everything? How about a gift of love and hope for someone through the ELCA Global Barnyard?





How you can help:

\$500 Cow buys a highyielding cow

\$250 Fish

builds and stocks a community fish farm

\$50 Goat

provides a goat for a family

\$30 Pig

buys a pig for a family to break the cycle of poverty

\$25 Turkey

adds a turkey to a family's yard

\$10 Chicks

provides 10 chicks to build an egg business Animals provide families with food, funds, and fertilizer—all for a better future. Cows are especially valued. In some parts of Africa, cows are a family's security and bank account. Animal-related development projects are an important part of ELCA World Hunger's comprehensive and life-saving efforts.

How can a goat change a life? Zipporah, a widowed mother of seven children, lives on a one-acre farm in Kenya. Hunger, made worse by drought, threatened her family. ELCA World Hunger and partner the Lutheran World Federation support a program that provided Zipporah with a breeding goat and trained her to care for it. As one goat became many, Zipporah is able to provide for her family.

Goats are a helpful part of God's global barnyard because they are hardy, multiply rapidly, are easy to care for, and produce nutritious milk. Goats can survive in drought-stricken areas by eating drought-resistant shrubs and grass. Children can care for goats, which is especially helpful when families are dealing with a serious illness like HIV/AIDS.

Goats and other animals, part of God's global barnyard, provide families with food, funds, and fertilizer, breaking the cycle of hunger and poverty. Your gifts to the ELCA World Hunger Appeal for God's global barnyard go beyond livestock to provide training, access to safe water sources, help securing markets, and much more.

Little chicks bring big hope. Gifts to the ELCA World Hunger—God's global barnyard helped our long-time partner in Mexico, Amextra (Mexican Association for Rural and Urban Transformation), alleviate economic struggles. In the remote village of Nuevo, Jerusalém (New Jerusalem), Amextra provided 46 families with flocks of baby chicks.

For Juana and Miguel, who have four teenage boys, those little chicks made a big difference. In just a few months, the chickens were laying eggs that helped satisfy the appetites of their growing boys. Juana and Miguel's chicken business will provide stable nutrition and a sustainable income source.

October 2010 Council Report by Don Rowen, Council Vice-President

The Lord of Love council has held three meetings since the last issue of *The Love Letter* was published. These meetings are discussed below.

September 28 – September Council Meeting

The council held its September business meeting on September 28, 2010, and the minutes of this meeting are summarized as follows:

- The council discussed potential transition plans, such as when Pastor Bob would leave and when Pastor Brad might start.
- Pastor Bob reported that the Deacon Fund is depleted as he has had several requests for help in the last month.
- The council reviewed the latest version of the 2011 budget being developed.
- Each committee gave a report of its activities. Highlights included the plans for visits to all members as part of the stewardship campaign and a report that 26 youth attended the lock-in held on September 25.

October 10 – Special Congregational Meeting



The council called a special Congregational Meeting on Sunday, October 10, 2010, to vote on whether to extend a call to Pastor Brad Meyer, who had been recommended by the Call Committee and the Council. Before the congregational meeting, there was a single worship service at 9:00 a.m. at which Pastor Brad presided and preached. Then there was a forum at which Pastor Brad introduced himself and his family and answered questions from the congregation. At 11:30 a.m., the special Congregational Meeting was called to order. There was not a lot of discussion, so the question was called. The vote to call Pastor Brad passed by a wide margin, with 99 for and 1 against. Then a compensation package for Pastor Brad was presented for approval. The annual compensation was about \$55,978, which with benefits would be a total cost of about \$80,000. The total cost would be a few thousand dollars more than what we paid Pastor Bob. The compensation package was approved.

COUNCIL REPORT

October 2010 Council Report, continued

Pastor Bob will serve at Lord of Love through Sunday, November 14. We will hold a potluck on Sunday, November 7 after the 10:30 a.m. worship service to honor his service to us. Pastor Brad will start at Lord of Love around Monday, November 15 and will be installed on Sunday, November 21. There will be a congregational potluck on November 21 after the 10:30 a.m. worship service to celebrate his installation.

October 19 – Strategic Planning Meeting

A Strategic Planning Meeting was held on October 19, 2010, and the minutes of this meeting are summarized as follows:

The main topic of the meeting was the Youth program. Adam Lueders, the youth director, and members of the Youth Support Team attended the meeting. The attendees discussed the goals of the youth program, the activities that the youth program should be doing to meet those goals, and the help that Adam and the youth program need to reach those goals. Adam reported that the youth lock-in went well and that they are making plans for the rest of the year. He did need help with planning and executing some events. He was getting help from some college-aged adults. We discussed how the Youth Support Team could help and that

Adam could seek some more members to act as youth sponsors. Another item that needed improvement was communication about youth activities to the congregation in *The Love Letter* and on the website.

- Brian Lund discussed the need to get new computers for Pastor Brad and Mary Lou as our current computers are 8 to 10 years old. He proposed that we buy two new computers and software and accessories at a cost not to exceed \$2,000. The motion carried.
- A congregation meeting will be held on Sunday, November 14. The budget approval and council election will be held. The nominating committee has found a nominee for each open position (see pages 11-12, Council Report).


