Nebraska Synod ELCA Commissions Brad Meyer and Judy Nanfito as Spiritual Directors

The Rev. Brad Meyer of Lord of Love Lutheran Church and Judy Nanfito of Trinity Lutheran Church were certified as spiritual directors by Nebraska Synod ELCA Bishop David deFreese in a November 10 ceremony held at the Carol Joy Holling Retreat Center near Ashland.

Meyer and Nanfito joined 11 others in this year's class of new spiritual directors. The class is the first to complete the program through Seeking the Spirit Within, the Nebraska Synod's Institute for Spiritual Direction.



Spiritual direction is an ancient form of strengthening and encouraging one another in our personal relationship with Christ. The institute was created in 2008 in response to an increasing request for spiritual direction and spiritual retreats throughout the synod.

Vera Hummel, the institute's director, called the journey with this class of spiritual directors a privilege.

"It was clear that much personal transformation occurred over the past two years, preparing them to listen well to others and to God," Hummel said.

Meyer said the experience of becoming a spiritual director has challenged him to see where God's presence is.

"I hope to direct others on this wonderful journey to develop a deeper relationship with God," he said.

Nanfito said the experience of becoming a spiritual director has taught her to listen more deeply to God and others.

"I hope to help others explore their own experiences of God as I accompany them along the sacred path of their spiritual journeys," she said.

Dear Lord of Love,

The fall semester of my last year in seminary is coming to a close, and my first-call paperwork is in. The first week in December, I will be meeting with my candidacy committee here in Nebraska to be approved for ordination, and if all goes well, I will receive my first-call region assignment at the end of February. It has been a long road, but when I look back on it all, I am extremely grateful for the experiences and the learning I have received on the journey.

This semester, I took some just-for-fun courses on the theology of Martin Luther and a religion and science seminar on creation. I also took an interfaith class called "Religions in Dialogue," which was co-taught by a Christian, Buddhist, and Muslim professor. As you can imagine, we had lively and sometimes tense conversations. My favorite class was a senior seminar called "Narratives of Hope." We got to read poems, novels, and memoirs, and watch movies and plays as we explored the themes of hope and despair in our calling as pastoral caregivers.

My husband Rich is enjoying his internship year at United in Faith on the northwestern side of Chicago, although he does not enjoy the forty-five minute to an hour commute one way each day. I am enjoying my brief role as the pastor's wife! It is wonderful to have a caring worship community from week to week, and even more wonderful for me to simply sit back and worship!

Coming up, I will be taking a class on early childhood faith development and education over January term. I am looking forward to some time spent relaxing at home and with friends, even while I continue my work at the after-school program where I worked my first two years of seminary. I have come a long way since I came to LSTC four years ago, but some things have not changed. God's presence as a rock of strength and love in Jesus Christ has remained with me. God's promise of grace and forgiveness has been there since my baptism. And I know that when I come home to Lord of Love, a lot has changed for you, too. We have a new pastor, and some of the faces are unfamiliar to me. At the same time, I know that your love and support for me in your prayers and in your giving continue faithfully. For that I am deeply grateful.

COUNCIL REPORT

November 2010 Council Report by Don Rowen, Council Vice-President

The Lord of Love council held two meetings in November: the semi-annual congregational meeting and its regular November council meeting. These meetings are discussed below.

Semi-annual Congregational Meeting

A Congregational Meeting was held on Sunday, November 14, 2010. Brian Lund began the meeting by reviewing significant events that have occurred in the past year and the goals of the council for the year.

Next, the congregation approved the budget proposed by the council without change. The budget had projected expenses of \$288,265. The projected income based on previous giving was \$266,000, leaving a projected deficient of \$22,265. The council was concerned about the deficient but was hopeful that the deficient would be reduced or eliminated through a combination of the ministries continuing to spend less than their budget and increased giving and growth of the congregation in the coming year. Significant changes to the budget from last year include: (1) increasing giving to the congregational mission to 3.5% and then using 1% of that fund to give to the Nebraska Synod Feed the Roots campaign that supports synod activities that develop current and future church leaders; (2) a \$7,482 increase in pastoral compensation for Pastor Brad; (3) a \$3,000 increase in compensation for the office administer; and (4) a 3% increase in salary for worship staff.

Brian Lund also thanked members of the council, the call committee, and ministry teams for their service to the church in the past year.

November Council Meeting

The council held a meeting on November 16, 2010. This was their first meeting with Pastor Brad. The council committees reviewed their responsibilities and then their activities, successes, and problems from the past year, which are summarized as follows:

- Resources reported that the stewardship campaign went pretty well but could have used more extensive visitor training. The campaign received pledges of \$220,674 (an increase of \$12,099).
- Property is working to get the driveway fixed and develop priorities for the Major Improvement Fund for the coming year.
- Nurture reported difficulties in getting volunteers to help with education and fellowship events and in avoiding having to ask the same members again.
- Outreach reported that the Mission Possible team is working well and that it now has an active Communication team discussing ways to improve our various forms of communication (website, Facebook, and The Love Letter). Another challenge was getting newer members involved in the life of the church.

The council also discussed the challenge they have faced in trying to plan and offer worship services that are inspiring to all and in considering changes to the worship service.

The council reviewed its current financial situation. The church is now a little over \$2,000 in the hole for the year, and the bank balance is low enough that we need to be careful about paying big bills. The church also owes Pastor Bob for several weeks of vacation time, continuing education, etc. We will pay him back over the next few months.






