### Confirmation Sunday by Pastor Brad Meyer

On Sunday, May 4<sup>th</sup> we will celebrate with four young people of the congregation as we participate in the service of Affirmation of Baptism (Confirmation).

I remember the excitement of my own Confirmation Sunday. I wore my red, white and blue polyester suit (yes – polyester!) and as my fellow confirmands, also dressed in their best, joined in affirming our faith we felt the presence of the congregation who had supported us and raised us to be people of faith. It was the next step in our journey of faith.

Our young people have been nurtured as well by the people of Lord of Love as they have grown in years. And they have not just completed a twoyear study of stories from the Old and New Testament, our Lutheran understanding of the Lord's Supper, Holy Baptism, and the 10 Commandments, but have also asked you and I questions about faith and how it affects their daily life.

Throughout the past two years they have heard how being an active part of a worshipping church community is what sustains us as we journey through life. A church community is not only a group that gathers for worship, but also walks with you during trying times and during celebrations in your life.

On May 4, these young people will "affirm" what was done for them at the time of their baptism. They will say "yes" to the promise of forgiveness of sins that was given to them as the waters of baptism were splashed upon their heads. They will say "yes" to living as a Christian in society and that through their words and actions they will speak about the love of Christ.

With hands placed on their heads they will hear words similar to words used at many of our confirmation services:

"Father in heaven, for Jesus' sake, stir up in \_\_\_\_\_\_ the gift of your Holy Spirit; confirm *her/his* faith, guide *her/his* life, empower *her/his* in *her/his* serving, give *her/his* patience in suffering, and bring *her/him* to everlasting life. Amen."

These words are a blessing and a prayer for the confirmand, and all of us, for the Spirit of God to dwell in us and to sustain us in life.

The service of Affirmation of Baptism is a time to examine our own faith journey and affirm our baptism. As these young people make public profession of their faith, we too can recommit ourselves to living as Christian people in the world.

My prayer is that each of us will have the power of the Holy Spirit stir in us and that our faith is renewed as these young people commit themselves to a continuing journey of faith.

### Coffee: Pour Justice to the Brim!

The coffee we drink every Sunday is very special. The congregation uses "Fellowship" coffee from The Lutheran World Relief Fair Trade Coffee Project.

Through the LWR Coffee Project, a partnership between Lutheran World Relief and Equal Exchange, we enjoy delicious fairly traded products while supporting small-scale farmers across the world. Farmers earn a fair price for their crops, have access to affordable credit, and can invest in education, health care and sustainable agriculture, building a better future for their families.

For all fairly traded coffee, tea, cocoa, sugar, and snacks purchased through the LWR Coffee Project, Equal Exchange gives \$.20 per pound back to Lutheran World Relief for projects supporting small-scale coffee farmers.



So when you have your cup of coffee on Sunday, or at any fellowship event, remember that this coffee is helping our brothers and sisters across the world. Fair trade coffee is more expensive than what you might pay for store brand, but it is good to know we are supporting small scale farmers to have a living wage. Please give generously when having your cup of Joe!

### Reflections on the Parable of the Sower, by Deb Lund

It is the season for readying the soil and planting here in the central plains, and more attention and care are needed this year after the long, dry, bitterly cold winter.

Most seeds and plants cannot grow without proper soil. This involves preparation, amending the soil for acid to alkaline balance, ensuring live nutrients, sufficient moisture and fertilizer. Likewise, our faith cannot grow without such care and nourishment. One needs sustenance to sustain one's faith.

What are you doing to nurture your faith? Do you take time for God? Do you remember to pray and prioritize your schedule to foster a healthy relationship with God? Do you attend worship and education opportunities regularly? How are you modeling your faith in your daily life?

Remember that all that we have and are belong to God. We are called to share our gifts with others as best we can. It has been said that it is better to give than to receive. There is no doubt that we get much more than we give of our time, talent and treasures, which helps strengthen our faith. God's blessings and peace to each of you as enjoy this season of growing.

### Will our Children be Generous? by Rex Quadhamer

Today, tomorrow, and every day, children will be exposed to over 5,000 messages geared to get them to spend money on themselves. These messages try to convince children they are worth what they possess. Who will send them the messages about the benefits of being generous people who share and save their money as well as spend it? Who will teach them that they are valued by God just the way they are, regardless of what they own or what they wear?

Over the next several months, we will provide suggestions, such as:

- Model the behavior you want. Let your children see you giving donations to charitable causes and doing random acts of kindness for others. Talk about why you support the organizations you do and why you help others. Talk about why you try to conserve natural resources and why you care about how the food and products you purchase were made.
- 2. Teach and model the 10-10-80 concepts: Share a tenth, save a tenth, spend the rest wisely. Provide your children a method to set aside a tenth for charity, a tenth for savings and a way to track how they spend the rest. Use envelopes or jars to separate their allowance, gifts and earned income. Give them a notebook in which to record what they do with the money that passes through their hands.



### The Church and Criminal Justice: Hearing the Cries

A social statement addressing issues in the criminal justice system was mandated by the 2007 ELCA Churchwide Assembly; subsequently the ELCA Task Force on Criminal Justice issued the proposed statement, "The Church and Criminal Justice: Hearing the Cries." The statement's text and its 11 implementing resolutions were reviewed by the Conference of Bishops in March 2013, the ELCA Church Council in April 2013, and adopted by the 2013 ELCA Churchwide Assembly.

The statement presents a comprehensive perspective on matters related to the U.S. criminal justice system and the many communities affected by this system. It affirms the principles of the U.S. criminal justice system, but also reveals the desperate cries that reflect the system's serious deficiencies. Drawing from the biblical witness to God's rich forms of love and justice for all humanity, the ELCA is compelled to address the need for a change in public attitude and posture, and to call for dramatic reforms in policies and practices in the criminal justice system.

### Our Giving Status by Lisa Meyer

General Fund financial information for March 2014:

- Actual Income \$29,392.75
- Actual Expenses \$25,974.95

General Fund financial information for the year to date through March 2014:

- Actual Income \$78,801.75
- Actual Expenses \$82,194.86

Through the end of the first quarter, there is currently a shortfall of approximately \$6,600 of offerings and other income needed to meet our budgeted expenses. As you may recall, the budget was approved at the November annual meeting with a deficit of \$18,500. Mission funds of approximately \$4,000 from 2013 have not yet been disbursed due to our financial condition.

We are running behind YTD on envelope giving. As a congregation we are very generous for specific mission or other causes, but for general giving we seem to lag. As of April 20, \$4028.00 has not been paid out for the 2013 Mission Project to Lutheran Family Services because of insufficient funds.

### Vision Trip to Tanzania Rescheduled for February 2–17, 2015

The June 2014 Nebraska Synodical Women's Organization Women of the ELCA Vision Trip to Tanzania was canceled and rescheduled. Due to the low number who expressed interest in the Vision Trip, this trip will be rescheduled to coincide with the February 2015 Nebraska Synod Vision Trip. There were several factors that went into the cancellation decision including the February date is approximately \$400 cheaper. The Nebraska Synod Vision trip will be February 2-17, 2015.

The Lord of Love Women of the ELCA will offer one scholarship for this trip, valued at least \$1,700. They have been holding events and raising monies the last couple of years to send two women on a mission-vision trip and the opportunity has arrived. We would like to help assist another woman to attend with Jackie Combes, recipient of the scholarship awarded last fall. There is a scholarship form (attached to the end of this issue of the Love Letter) to be completed and returned to Gwen Edwards **by June 1, 2014.** 

The approximate cost of this trip is \$4,500 per person (estimated). This cost covers airfare, visa, ground transportation, all lodging and meals. You will be responsible for securing your passport (if necessary) and inoculations which, depending on what you have had, will be approximately \$250-\$700, and oral anti-malarial medication taken during the trip. For tipping, figure about \$3 per day. A non-refundable deposit of \$300 is due now to reserve your spot.

All trip costs are based on best current information and are subject to change. Trip participants are responsible for any increase in airline taxes and fuel surcharges imposed by the airline or change in Tanzania hotel and ground transportation.
