Compare that to the number of daily reminders of our life of faith, and what that number might be." *(Seeds for the Parish*, Fall 2014)

Indeed we are bombarded by information at a tremendous rate through television ads, smartphone apps and updates, webpages and even in print. So often it is not a choice to avoid it because ads are constantly in front of us.

We've experienced the increase in political ads and now are gearing up for the Christmas ads to hit us at full force. But, in the midst of the ads that we cannot avoid, I encourage you to try your best to "unplug" from the sources that grab our attention and set aside a few moments each day to spend it with God. November is known as the "month to give THANKS to God" for so many things that we have in this life. This month, spend some time lifting gratitude to God. Each day, spend a few minutes listing three or four things (or 300–500) that you are grateful for from the previous day.

Spend a couple of minutes thanking God before beginning or ending your day with gratitude. Maybe, as we practice giving thanks and living in gratitude, the ads that bombard us won't seem so overwhelming.

ELCA Provides \$100,000 to Support Containing Ebola in Africa

To help contain the Ebola outbreak in Africa, provide food assistance and more, members of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) have committed an initial \$100,000 as of Sept. 25. These funds support the response efforts of partners and Lutheran companion churches in Africa.

Through Lutheran Disaster Response, the following allocations are underway:

- \$25,000 to the Lutheran Church of Liberia, which is providing food assistance to nearly 1,000 households in six territorial areas.
- \$15,000 to the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Sierra Leone, which is overseeing the distribution of oil, rice and fish to 3,000 individuals.
- \$50,000 to ACT Alliance (Lutheran Development Service in Liberia), working to raise awareness and share messages about Ebola symptoms and prevention methods to 4,500 individuals (2,000 males and 2,500 females) in Liberia. Lutheran Development Service hired a contractor to ensure that the construction of the isolation center at Phebe Hospital and School of Nursing meets World Health Organization standards.
- This past summer, \$10,000 was given to Global Health Ministries at the request of the Lutheran Church in Liberia. Global Health Ministries provides medical supplies and funding for health care programs in Lutheran churches in 20 countries.

"South African Presiding Bishop N.P. Phaswana once said that 'if we are all part of the body of Christ and if one part of the body is suffering from HIV and AIDS, then we must say that the body of Christ is HIV positive.' This startling observation brought home to me the realization that what happens to one part of the church is not something distant or separate from our (ELCA) part of the church. This is true now about the Ebola crisis," said the Rev. Elizabeth A. Eaton, presiding bishop of the ELCA.

"St. Paul tells us, 'If one member suffers, all suffer together with it.' 1 Corinthians 12:26," she said. "But we are not without hope. God has given us all that we need to contain and overcome this crisis. It is up to the whole body to respond. The second part of 1 Corinthians 12:26 is '... if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it,'" said Eaton.

"We need food," said the Rev. D. Jensen Seyenkulo, bishop of the Lutheran Church in Liberia. "There is a saying (here) now: 'If we don't die of Ebola, we will die of starvation.'"

According to the Rev. Andrea Walker, ELCA area program director for West Africa, the "West Africa and Diakonia teams of ELCA Global Mission have had regular communications with our companions in Liberia and Sierra Leone since the Ebola outbreak began early this year.

The Ebola outbreak "is truly unprecedented," said Dr. Rebecca Duerst, ELCA program director for global health. "The outbreak is not only causing an extraordinary number of deaths but also from other treatable diseases, childbirth and starvation."

"There are really two stories here," said the Rev. Daniel Rift, director of ELCA World Hunger and Disaster Appeal. "One is the immediate need and response. But the second is about the long-term commitment and the difference it makes that so many generously support the church's efforts to address poverty, hunger and health year in and year out through the ELCA."

"When a situation like this arises, the importance of the church's commitment to be present in a community, with ministry of health and hunger, become clear. It is because of this ongoing work that the ELCA is able to confidently encourage support through health centers and programs in Liberia and Sierra Leone. These churches have experience, through good times and difficult days, to provide food and build for sustainability. And it is our privilege to stand with them now as they work in this most difficult situation," said Rift, who also expressed his gratitude to ELCA members "who are responding to this special invitation for support."

In addition to providing assistance to those within our own community, our donations to the ELCA will go a long way to assist people nationally and abroad.

The ELCA website states, "Lutheran Disaster Response brings God's hope, healing and renewal to people whose lives have been disrupted by disasters in the United States and around the world." Areas where the ELCA is responding include: U.S. tornadoes, U.S. flooding, Gaza Humanitarian Assistance and the Ebola Outbreak Response

Stewardship, by Clay and Kelly Schroeder

When I was asked to write about the stewardship of the church, I immediately thought of Gary Chapman's book, *The Five Love Languages*. If you are familiar with this book, he references the fact that we as human beings receive love in five basic ways: *words of affirmation, acts of service, receiving gifts, quality time, and physical touch.*

My family was affected by the illness of our youngest son, Isaac. We first found out about this illness during a routine ultrasound during an otherwise normal pregnancy. Of those first few minutes, all we can remember is the fear and uncertainty of what the future may hold. After consultations with doctors and lots of reading, we came to understand that our son would likely need a kidney transplant. Getting him to that transplant was not going to be an easy task.

After making this realization, it was unbelievable the amount of fear, sadness, anger and shame that came with bringing a child into this earth that was going to bear significant need.

Isaac was born about two months early because of his illness. At that time, we shared the news with Pastor Brad. Our baby boy spent 26 days in the neonatal ICU and in this time we begin to see what love a church family can unveil. Almost immediately, we were offered multiple meals, which continued well through the time that our son was hospitalized. These gifts were so greatly appreciated at a time when we were still spending many hours in the hospital, working and trying to keep some sort of normalcy for our other three children. If you have ever been in such a stressful situation, just having a meal prepared with love is something that shows support of the community. All of this came with no questions asked and unbelievable thankfulness for us.

During these trying times, we were offered babysitters and volunteers to help transport our children to their events when everyone knew that we were stressed and having to spend significant time in the hospital watching over our little boy. Trusting our friends to help us maintain our "normal life" was an unbelievable benefit to our children. No one had to miss a dance practice or piano lesson as others were able to help us with our scheduling. These acts of service did not go unnoticed.

After we were able to bring him home and attend one of the church services, I was reading the back of the bulletin and saw my son's name on the prayer list. This meant that many strangers, who would never meet him, were placing him in their thoughts and prayers. When we came into church, we were met with so many kind words and words of encouragement. These words of affirmation, that God's love was present without asking, are a perfect example of how our congregation is a steward of the word that God proclaims.

Throughout our journey, our son was hospitalized on a couple of different occasions and received his transplant when he was a year and a half old. During those times, Pastor Brad spent hours with me in waiting rooms. It was always a pleasure to have him present during those endless minutes. The time would go so fast when I didn't have to use all of my energy thinking about the situation that put me there. That quality time is something that I hope I can give back someday. His conversations were such that the time could move so quickly.



While I was writing this, I was having some difficulty thinking of how the church shows its love by physical touch. And then, it "hit" me. When we walk into the church, there are so many people that reach out to shake our hands.

Another example is during the service, when we each give peace to each other. That sensation of touch is another way that the church shows love as well: with a gentle hand on the shoulder, or a handshake when we leave the sanctuary or when my little boy gives me a gigantic hug before he goes to bed.

I am reminded of how we have been helped in so many ways: many ways that I know I can't repay, but I can hope to give back through the stewardship of the church.
