Lenten Soup Suppers



NE Synod sends \$100,000 to rebuild homes in Pilger *(from nebraskasynod.org)*


The Nebraska Synod said Friday that it is sending \$100,000 to assist in the rebuilding of homes lost in the June 2014 tornadoes that struck the town of Pilger.

Bishop Brian Maas said the gift is the result of funds collected by the Synod from individuals and congregations (such as Lord of Love!) throughout the state. “Nebraska Synod Lutherans have been eager to help the residents of Pilger in any way they can,” Maas said. “Helping our neighbors in their deepest time of need is a part of our calling and our congregations have responded well.”

The opportunity to provide assistance in rebuilding the homes is part of an effort by the Northeast Nebraska Long Term Recovery Team and the Mennonite Disaster Service. The Nebraska Synod’s gift, combined with other available funding, will support the construction of six or more replacement homes in the Pilger community.

The \$100,000 accompanies an ongoing response by the ELCA through the Synod and Lutheran Family Services that has also included financial assistance for mental health services and the donation of volunteer labor in the aftermath of the disaster.

Maas said that Nebraska Synod congregations will continue to support people in the area affected by last summer’s storms. “As Lutherans, we know that this journey of recovery and renewal is a marathon and not a sprint.”

Youth Service at Siena Francis House

The youth group will volunteer to serve dinner at the Siena Francis House on Saturday, **April 18**. We will meet at the church at 4 p.m. to carpool down to the site. Service commitment is from 4:30 to 7 p.m. and we will return to the church at about 7:30. Sign up on the Bulletin Board in the Youth Corner of the Narthex so we know how many will be attending. A few adults will need to help carpool and serve dinner. **We need at least 15 youth volunteers!**

Suggestions to follow from the Siena Francis House for volunteers:

- Volunteers are given a short orientation and job assignments at the beginning of the volunteer shift.
- Volunteers must be at least 12 years old.
- It is a requirement of the Health Department that all volunteers wear closed-toe shoes – no sandals or flip-flops are allowed in the kitchen or dining room. Dress comfortable but conservatively – no tank tops or shorts less than 3 inches above the knee.
- If community service hours for school are needed, have paperwork signed by kitchen manager before leaving for the evening.
- Please do not bring any personal items or anything of value with you to volunteer. Siena Francis House cannot take responsibility for lost or stolen items. We is an area to store coats, but not a space available to secure personal items. This includes phones.
- The dining room is located at 1111 North 17th Street in Baright Men's Shelter.

“Rise Up” National ELCA Youth Gathering, from Heather Christensen

So what’s this “Youth Gathering” we keep hearing about?

The ELCA Youth Gathering for high school-age youth takes place every three years. It is about faith formation, worship, study, fellowship, service and play. Youth have the opportunity to engage with peers from across the United States and the world who share a common commitment and faith in Christ. The next Gathering will be held **July 15-19**, in Detroit, Michigan. This year’s theme is: *Rise Up Together.*

During the week, young people rotate through a variety of service learning experiences in the surrounding community. They explore and strengthen their faith by studying God’s word, serving their neighbor, sharing bread and wine in worship, participating in lively faith discussions, all while broadening their experience of God’s world and diverse communities.

When the question “Why work so hard to gather so many young people in one place?” pops up, the response is simple: ***We were meant to be together, and we are a church that believes God is calling us into the world — together.*** So every now and then, the ELCA gathers young people and adults together to share their unique stories and to experience the larger story that makes up the ELCA. We gather to be inspired, encouraged, strengthened, connected and sent out to do God’s work in the world — together!



Our Trip to Tanzania, by Joe Combes

Jackie and I left for Africa on Feb. 2, the day after the snowstorm. It was a 16 day trip. We had never left our family for a trip this long. We had waited about 16 months. The first trip was cancelled and I was not going on that trip. The second trip I was convinced, though still apprehensive about going.

So we left, and the journey to our destination was uneventful. Upon arriving, we stepped off the plane to a hot wind and an acrid smell that would not leave our nostrils until we left the city. It stunk.

Through the course of our stay, many things happened. Sometimes we had no water, and sometimes no electricity. There was no air conditioning – ever. We had no ice and drank very few cold drinks, even though it was hot – over 90 degrees!

Serengeti Safari

As we headed for the safari, 5 of us had to stay at a different hotel. This meant we had to get up earlier to go to the other hotel for breakfast.

The lodge we were going to stay at for the safari had a fire before we arrived – so we stayed at a lodge two hours further away, in the northern part of the Serengeti, rather than at the center.

We visited schools, hospitals, parishes, seminaries, bible colleges, and an orphanage.

We had two game drives that were fantastic – we saw all the animals you could ever want to see. We sat through a 5 and a half hour retirement ceremony for the bishop, all spoken in Swahili.

Travel Troubles

When it was time to come home, the ticketing equipment was down and we stood for several hours in line while they hand wrote the boarding passes and luggage tags. In Amsterdam we had to get the rest of our boarding passes, another glitch with the kiosk. After some actual human interaction, we were on our way.

When we were leaving Atlanta, we all boarded the plane, then the pilot announced that we

had a bad engine so we needed to deplane. An hour later we were boarding another plane and finally on our way home.

Experiencing the People of Tanzania

So that was what happened. But what follows is the experience:

God called 38 of us to Africa. We came with gifts, many gifts: money, medical supplies, ourselves, Christian love, compassion, knowledge, true desire to help, and our faith.

God has given these gifts to us, to bring and share with the people of Tanzania. The people of Tanzania responded with their gifts: They opened their arms and welcomed us. They gave of themselves – all they had. They showed us joy and happiness. They allowed us to worship with them.

Even though we didn't understand, we could feel the presence of God in their powerful singing.

We could feel it when the kindergarten class sang "You Raise me Up", in perfect English. The parish choir sang the "Hallelujah Chorus" again in perfect English.

They took time to speak with us, to show us special things they had to share: a waterfall, a cave, a museum, a store where they sold items made by the women of the parish.

They fed us with the best they had. They opened their homes for us to sleep in. They were a wonderful and gracious people. Most of the people had almost nothing, yet they gave us what they had. We came away greatly enriched by the gifts God had given us all to share.

Even though we didn't speak the same language, a handshake, a touch, a smile, a facial expression, often conveyed the message between us. Yes, God gave us all these gifts and we did truly share with each other. And when we left they told us they would miss us.

This was the experience.
It was what we sought.
It was what we found.
Glory to God, Amen.


