Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton on World Malaria Day

Dear friend,

Grace and peace to you! Over the past four years, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) has given special attention to **World Malaria Day on April 25**. This year, on World Malaria Day, a massive earthquake struck Nepal.

As a church, you responded to this crisis immediately. I am grateful for the generosity of congregations and individuals who quickly offered assistance through Lutheran Disaster Response. Together, we have raised \$400,000 to support recovery efforts. It is in these moments that I am heartened to see the profound way our long history of mission has put us exactly where God would have us to bring help and hope. Our prayers continue for the people of Nepal, especially for those who serve neighbors through our partners and companions. *(continued on next page)*

At the same time, opportunities to give continue for World Malaria Day – a time that traditionally raises a great deal of funds and awareness to help our sisters and brothers in Africa put an end to this preventable, treatable disease.

Our companions and partners are still counting on your support, and we could use your help now.

Five years ago the ELCA joined worldwide efforts to fight malaria by launching the ELCA Malaria Campaign. Our goal: \$15 million by 2015 to support the malaria programs of our Lutheran companions and partners. Today, we're 94 percent of the way there.

Together, our work has stretched into 13 countries throughout Africa. We have fully funded our commitments to 10 country programs with positive results underway, but communities in **three countries still are depending on your support**.

I give thanks for your past support and hope that you will prayerfully consider one more gift.

As we continue to celebrate new life in Christ, let us join together and ensure all of God's children live whole, healthy lives.

Call Process Update, from Dave Hild (as of May 20)

I would like to provide a short update regarding the process for calling a new pastor.

The ELCA has a handbook to help guide congregations through this process. We have a summary poster now in the Narthex, and it provides a pictorial outline of the process that is described in the handbook.



Where are we?

Our current phase of the process is to assemble what is known as the **Ministry Site Profile**. This congregational profile serves several purposes:

- it helps us come to a consensus regarding the kind of pastor needed for the next chapter our ministry.
- it is a means to communicate the congregation's hopes and dreams to the Synod.
- it helps the Synod Staff Liaison identify appropriate candidates for the Call Committee.
- It provides candidates with a picture of the congregation's needs and opportunities.

Who is working on it?

A committee, the **Ministry Site Profile Committee**, has been formed to lead the activities needed to gather the information from our membership to assemble this profile. This group met to plan our process of putting together Lord of Love's Site Profile. Those coming together for this ministry are:

- Myself (Dave Hild)

What can I do?

We won't do this process alone – we will be soliciting information from the congregation in various ways, including group discussion and an online survey, to gather this important information.

We look forward to everyone's input, assistance, and prayers as we prepare for this next phase of our ministry together at Lord of Love.

Stewardship Reflection: The Widow's Gift, by Rex Quadhamer



He looked up and saw rich people putting their gifts into the treasury; he also saw a poor widow put in two small copper coins. He said, "Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all of them; for all of them have contributed out of their abundance, but she out of her poverty has put in all she had to live on." (Mark 12:41-44)

I think I've observed over the years that poor people often are more generous than people who have a lot of money. You would think it would be the opposite, but they aren't as attached to their possessions because they don't have much.

When I was picking up food on May 9 while delivering mail (did you set out food for your carrier to pick up?), the poorer areas I delivered to were as or more generous than the wealthy. (continued...)


The Widow's Gift, continued

(By the way, we picked up an enormous amount of food for the food bank - I had to make 3 trips back to the office because my truck was getting filled up! Thanks to all who set out food.)

I notice in the Love Letter every month that we continue to have a big deficit at our church. While I was on council last year, I mentioned maybe we need to make more cuts in our budget but was told we were already at bare bones in spending. It seems that then we should be running a surplus and not a deficit.

While not yet tithing, our family has increased our giving significantly over the past year. It can be hard, but everything I've read in the Bible and heard at church asks us to live lives of faith. That is our calling.

When I was at Scottsbluff a year and a half ago for the Synod Mission Field Trip (we did work at the Lakota Lutheran church) I heard an interesting statement from a synod member. We were eating at a Chinese buffet and they were talking about sometimes



having to spy on congregations who were having a lot of conflict. I mentioned to them that if they come to our church, I'll know who they are. But they told me and Fred (who goes to Bennington), "Don't worry. We won't be spying on *your* churches."

It's nice to know we're held in such high esteem because of who we are as a church! I'm proud to belong to such a generous congregation. God bless.



Few things affect our daily life more. It seems appropriate that the Bible gives so much attention to money and giving. Yet, it's too common to see Bible passages taken out of context, turned into catchy slogans, and enforced as rules that Christians should follow."


