# MISSION AND OUTREACH

#### **Update on Prison Ministries**

As you may recall, our 2015 summer breakfast proceeds went to the NE Synod Prison Ministries. Pastor Bob Bryan, pastor of Followers of Christ congregation in the Nebraska prisons, preached at Lord of Love and spoke to us during a breakfast in July 2015. He recently reported on the use of the funds we provided to Nebraska Synod prison ministries:

women inmates package

"The women inmates packaged dry food ingredients into a bag that feeds 6 people a complete nutritionally balanced meal by only boiling it in water! An inmate on the inmate council at the Nebraska Correctional Center for Women in York wrote to me asking about ideas for the prisoners, who wanted to give back to the community. I sent her information on Kids Against Hunger and she got the warden's approval. Kids Against Hunger was able to bring their packaging operation into the prison.

A typical two-hour event with 20 volunteers would pack \$1,400 worth of ingredients, but we could only do it if we found funding. Then your donation to Followers of Christ arrived in the mail! The women worked so diligently that they packed all the ingredients almost twice as fast as usual! They packed 5,808 meals for shipment across the world wherever needed."

# First Fruits, New Beginnings. by Deb Lund

I love spring. I love seeing plants popping up in our garden beds, shrubs getting little green leaves, and flowering trees blooming this time of year. I readily remember the smells of being out in the pasture during this "new beginnings" time of year, getting the cows to come home for milking each day.

I also remember clearly my Dad writing a check to the church soon after getting his milk check each month. It was a habit, and one that taught me well: We give back to God some of what he has first given us. He did not talk about it, but good financial stewardship was evident. Mom and Dad modeled generosity of time, too. They were very active in the church and community, serving on boards and committees, teaching Sunday School, and more.

Our daughter Pastor Rebecca witnessed the sharing of first fruits in her congregations in Benedict and Swedehome. (continued on next page)...

#### First Fruits, New Beginnings, continued

The farmers freely gave of their harvests and proceeds from the sale of livestock each year. Many farmers also were able to give of their time more generously following the harvest, when their schedules allowed for that.

In our early years of marriage, we wrote the first check each month to the church, but we needed some guidance and encouragement to better understand our financial stewardship. A tool that really helped us was *proportionate giving*, giving as a percentage of our income. A proportional concept of giving and using a growth-giving chart helped us better comprehend how much we were contributing to the church and other organizations.

For example: if we earn \$52,000 per year (\$1000/week) and contribute \$30 per week, we give 3% of our income. If our income increases to \$54,600 (\$1050/week), our giving increases *proportionately* to \$31.50 per week to stay at 3%. If our annual income decreases to \$46,800 (\$900/week), and we continue to contribute 3%, we would give \$27 per week. A *growth-giving* adjustment of an additional 1% of income (total 4%), using the \$1000/week income, means our gifts would increase to \$40 per week.

Of course, what we do with all of God's gifts is most important. But, perhaps take time to prayerfully consider:

- Is supporting God's mission included in the first checks you write each month?
- Are you regularly contributing your time and talents to help others?

In this season of new beginnings, please take a moment to review this proportional giving chart and reflect on your financial giving back to God. You may find this helpful in growing your giving.

For they voluntarily gave according to their means, and even beyond their means.

2 Corinthians 8:3

Instructions :

your giving level in percent. We encourage each household to increase giving 1 percent per year. Find your annual or weekly income in one of the first two columns. Then look across the row to determine

Example :

A 1 percent increase (from 3 percent to 4 percent) would be about an additional \$10 per week. This is a portion of what has been given by God to be managed and then is returned to do ministry. For a household earning \$52,000 per year and contributing about \$30 per week, the contribution is about 3 percent of income.

#### One more time (From Joe Combes):

I want to one more time thank all of the people of Lord of Love for their thoughts, prayers and words of encouragement in the past years of my time with my father in his illness. You all were an inspiration to me as we traveled the road to the end of his life.

I shared some stories with you at his funeral, and you graciously listened, I thank you for that, his death was truly a heart wrenching experience for me. I have one more story I would like to share with you.

As my father's health declined, I enlisted the the Visiting Nurses Association to help with his care. As we came closer to the end and hospice care was appropriate he was assigned a hospice nurse.

Sue Miller was the nurse who was assigned to my father. She was a very wonderful, caring person who was actually a Catholic nun. Initially, my father was a bit resentful having her care for him, but as their relationship developed he came to understand the she was there to help him.

I wasn't always there when she came to visit Dad, but I want to relate this one incident when I was present. As Sue finished her duties for the day she started to walk out the door, as she did my Dad said, "See you Babe," she turned in the door, her face brightened, and with a shy smile and gentle voice she said, "See you Don". It reminded me of a scene out of a Bogart movie.

My father passed a short time later. I called Sue to thank her for all she had done for myself and my family. She told me she truly loved my Dad. What a wonderful ending—because of her care my father was able to die with grace and dignity.

Again, my struggles in this time would have been much greater had it not been for the support of my Wife, the caring people at the VNA, especially Sue Miller, my immediate family, and my wonderful family at Lord of Love, together you all make my life complete. Thank you so much.
