FROM THE INTERIM PASTOR

Greetings in the Spirit of Pentecost,

Ubuntu is a word from the Bantu language in South Africa whose literal translation is, "I am because you are." Nelson Mandela, the first black president of South Africa, and now Archbishop emeritus Desmond Tutu, used the word to speak of the interconnectedness of all humanity to one another, to God, to the whole universe. For me, the word denotes the meaning of Pentecost.

The story of the first Pentecost tells of the miraculous connection that Peter's sermon, which detailed the life, death and resurrection of Jesus, made with persons from all over the known world. It connects them in a way that crosses all the cultural and language barriers that normally would divide them.

Our understanding of the known world has greatly expanded since that first Pentecost. Yet the message remains: we are connected to all the world through God's love made known in the

person of Jesus. Our celebration of Pentecost reminds us that we, too, have been breathed upon by Jesus and filled with his Spirit. We, too, have been called into community – a community that cares for all creation, works for justice and peace in all the earth, and serves all those in need of God's mercy, healing, forgiveness and love.

Come celebrate Pentecost on Sunday, May 15th. Wear red (not hard for Husker fans). And enter into the joy of God's community.

ZAMBIA: CONSTRUCTING NEW CHURCHES



THE NEED

The Evangelical Lutheran Church in Zambia is growing fast – so fast it needs more church buildings.

This young, vibrant church now has nearly 6,000 members in 40 worshiping communities spread across four provinces.

Of those 40 worshiping communities, only four have sturdy, weatherproof buildings. “The rest meet in thatched pole-and mud structures. There are instances when members would find themselves worshiping under a tree because their building collapsed in a windstorm,” says the Rev. Alfred Chana, senior pastor of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Zambia.

In order to grow as a church, our companion needs stronger buildings. ELCA missionary Arden Strasser describes it: “The fact is, sometimes in Africa, a church just needs bricks and mortar to meet, especially during the rainy season. “It’s not about the building; it’s what goes on inside the building. And we’ve seen, when you have a brick-and-mortar church that can stand up the whole year round, you can get a lot happening in there.”

The Evangelical Lutheran Church in Zambia has proposed an exciting new initiative in partnership with the ELCA through its Global Ministries program. With the support of ELCA members and congregations, together, we can raise \$500,000 to build up to 15 permanent church buildings in Zambia, starting with a leadership training center to support the pastors and evangelists who serve the growing church.

Pastor Chana foresees that congregations with modern buildings “will attract local community members, will not suspend worship in case of a rainy day or a windstorm, and can hold workshops and seminars.” Pastor Strasser continues, “A church structure is the hatching place for ideas and motivation. It matters!”

April Council Meeting Minutes

The Lord of Love Church Council met on April 19. Highlights include:

- Review of the **Treasurer's Report** which showed good attendance and an increase in giving in March. Budget deficit has decreased slightly.
- Resource Ministry reported **good results with the Clean Up Day** held on April 16. There is an ongoing issue with some of the condominiums' renters parking on the west drive into the church parking lot. Resources is looking into placing No Parking signs in this area.
- Outreach Ministry reports that the Communication Team is actively meeting and will soon have a **new website** in place. Much work has been done behind the scenes for this endeavor.
- Nurture reported that the **Lord of Love Preschool will be opening for the school year** on 9/6/16 with Carissa Combes as the director. It will be open 5 days per week with morning and afternoon class sessions.
- Council had extensive discussions about potential **ideas to raise monies** to reduce the deficit prior to our new pastor's arrival. **If you have any ideas, please share them with a Council Member.**
- Doug Aden reported that the **call committee** will be meeting next week with the Nebraska Synod representative to review the next steps in the call process.

As of the end of March, the available cash deficit has decreased slightly to (11,452.10). Weekly offerings of **\$7,217** are needed to meet budgeted expenses. The weekly offering average through the end of March was \$6,313. The monthly offering average was \$27,357 at the end of March.

No Need to Pledge? By Heather Hansen

The story is told of a wise pastor who went to get a hair cut. The barber, who also happened to be a parishioner, took the opportunity to tell the pastor all the reasons why the barber was not going to complete his stewardship pledge card.

“I don’t think we should have to promise to give money to God. We should give what our heart tells us at the time. I like to be able to just put in the collection whatever I have that week.”

The pastor listened carefully and after his haircut he handed the barber \$1 for the \$10 haircut, saying, “I like to give what my heart tells me – just whatever I have in my pocket at the time.”

“Father,” the barber protested, “I can’t pay my rent, take care of my expenses and run my business successfully if everyone would do that.”

“Neither can God,” the pastor replied.

This story has a lot of truth to it. We need to take time and think about what our pledge means for the church, not just the Sunday that it is given, but what it could be over time. We are not only helping keep God’s house up and running for the week, but hopefully for generations to come.

Think about the barber’s protest: “I can’t pay my rent, take care of my expenses and run my business successfully if everyone would do that”. Can we really take care of God’s house if we were all to do that as well? As a family takes care of their home and the necessities that come with it, we also need to think the same—like a church family taking care of our “home”.

Lately, I've been doing a lot of, well, *doing*—both at church (call process!) and in other areas of my life. What I mean is not necessarily that I've been busy. What I mean is, if someone asks me to do something—serve on a committee, take notes, help with just about anything—I will almost always do it. When I say "yes," I don't consider how I feel — just what I can do.

But you have probably experienced the point at which you start to max out on saying "yes", on doing. It was time to choose to just be—to be with others, maybe even to be uncomfortable, to be present without the intention of completing a task. Not because I should, or because it would be helpful or productive, but simply because it would be good.

Kelly Duffy did a fantastic job leading the day's activities and **Ruth Manning** prepared a tasty lunch. **Amy Kragnes** led us in musical worship. Every woman contributed something unique and wonderful.



The day centered around one special verse: "Thy words were found and I ate them, and Thy words became for me a joy and the delight of my heard; for I have been called by Thy name, O Lord God of Hosts" (Jeremiah 15:16). Kelly led us in strategies from Waylon B. Moore's "Living God's Word" to meditate on this verse and others in our everyday Bible reading. We explored what this verse on joy means in the context of the book of Jeremiah, "the weeping prophet." No matter how bad things may seem or what the circumstances may be, we rejoice in the Word of God.

Each woman explored a verse of her own and shared in a small group. We looked at references to oil in scripture passages and Biblical times, comparing it to the use of the same substance today, and learned about the therapeutic properties of essential oils. We talked about how an actor might prepare to play Jesus in a film ("The Book of Matthew"). We ate and sang. We listened to one another share about the things that give each of us joy.
