PASTOR'S PAGE

I have been here for almost a month, and I'm loving it here! I have been impressed at the way you care for and love one another. Sadly, we have already had to say "see you later" to some loved ones, as they have moved away, gone overseas to work, or have gone to be with the Lord. This place is full of fun-loving people who make it all happen, for which I am so thankful! I also had a great time "Bowling for Jesus" for the Machame Hospital in Tanzania.

March 1 is, of course, the kick-off to the season of Lent. It is always a good time for us to focus in on our relationship with God by adding something to help us do so, or by choosing to take something out of our lives either permanently or during the season of Lent to acknowledge that some of the things we have and spend time on are things we give more importance to than we should. Last year, I did the 40 bags of decluttering. (Sadly when I moved, it was evident I should have been doing the 365 bags of decluttering!) Whatever you do to honor this time of reflection and focus on our baptismal journeys, may Lent help you grow and have an impact on your spiritual lives.

During Lent, we will be focusing on the Nebraska Synod's theme of "We Are Church." In conjunction with this as our focus during Midweek Lenten Worship, it will also be that of the scriptures and questions we ponder and explore for Adult Education on Sunday mornings (in the North wing of the sanctuary).

Lastly, I have been asked to share with you a little bit about my boys, so the last few paragraphs are about the three boys in my life.

WORSHIP

Lenten Services

Midweek services will begin on Ash Wednesday, March 1 at 7 p.m. This service will be a traditional Ash Wednesday service with Communion and imposition of ashes.

The theme for the next five services will be "we are Church." Each week will also have a theme:

March 8:	We are Church
March 15:	We are One
March 22:	We are Holy
March 29:	We are Catholic
April 5:	We are Apostolic



For each theme, there are several questions that call for congregational discussion. Pastor Becky will use one of those questions during the Lenten service. The others will be discussed at the adult forum on Sunday between services, or Pastor Becky may use them for discussion as she interacts with various groups and committees of the congregation.

March Worship Notes

During Lent, the liturgy on Sundays will be ELW3 with the Kyrie.

March 5: First Sunday in Lent

The gospel lesson tells us of Jesus' temptation in the desert. In the early church, Lent was a time to prepare for those to be baptized for Easter. We focus on the meaning of faith in our Lenten journey to the baptismal waters of Easter.

March 12: Second Sunday in Lent

Jesus tells Nicodemus that he must be born of water and Spirit. At the font, we are given new birth as daughters and sons of God. In baptism, God promises to raise us up with Christ to new life. From worship, we are sent forth to proclaim God's love.

March 19: Third Sunday in Lent

In the gospel, the Samaritan woman asks Jesus for water and Jesus offers living water. As we journey to the resurrection feast, Christ comes among us in word, bath, and meal, offering us the life-giving water of God's mercy and forgiveness.

March 26: Fourth Sunday in Lent

The gospel tells the story of the man born blind and healed by Christ. In baptism, God opens our eyes to see the truth of who we are: God's beloved sons and daughters. We were blind, and now we see and we can bear witness to the light of Christ in our daily lives.


Mission Possible Update

Presiding Bishop Addresses President Trump's Refugee Executive Order

CHICAGO (Jan. 30, 2017) – The Rev. Elizabeth A. Eaton, presiding bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), has issued a pastoral message addressing President Trump's executive order to restrict entry by refugees and visitors into the United States from seven predominately Muslim countries.

Eaton's message follows.

Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy. Yesterday, we heard these words in the Gospel reading from Matthew 5:1-12, the beginning of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount. In the Beatitudes, Jesus lays out a vision for life in God's realm, characterized by seeing those who are often most disregarded, including the meek, the mourning and the peacemaker, as bearers of God's blessing. Over the coming weeks, we will continue to hear this Gospel, including Jesus' call for his disciples to be carriers of God's light and hope and reconciliation to a world deeply in need of them.

Earlier last week, I communicated with the Trump administration asking that it not stop the U.S. refugee admissions program or stop resettlement from any country for any period of time. The Bible calls us to welcome the stranger and treat the sojourner as we would our own citizens. I agree with the importance of keeping our country secure as the administration stated in its executive order last Friday, but I am convinced that temporarily banning vulnerable refugees will not enhance our safety nor does it reflect our values as Christians. Instead, it will cause immediate harm by separating families, disrupting lives, and denying safety and hope to brothers and sisters who are already suffering.

Refugees being resettled in the United States have fled persecution because of their race, religion, nationality, political views and/or associations. They wait for years for the chance to go home. But sometimes, there is no home for them to go back to. We know from our partners at Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service (LIRS) that only 1 percent of all refugees are chosen for resettlement.






