PASTOR'S PAGE

"Preaching on the Borders" was the theme of the Homiletics Festival I had the privilege to attend this past month. As one might expect, we heard some great sermons on how Jesus is always pushing borders, and how there is always more than one way to look at a story. However, if we don't look at all the angles of a story, then people who are counting on us to be bringers of the Good News are not going to get to hear how Jesus is present even when life doesn't fit into the cookie cutter interpretation we often hear and share in preaching.

This past month especially, I was confronted with a whole lot of world I wasn't sure I really wanted to greet, nor get to know personally. And why? Because sometimes thinking about and including the other is not so pleasant and can be really tough. Every day of the conference walking to and from my hotel, I was asked at least once, if I could help this or that person out in any way. However, from past convictions, I wasn't going to ignore them. so I looked them in the face and said. "Hi" as I passed him or her. However, when the followup to "hi" would start with a desperate look and a hand extended. I knew I'd be asked for a handout. Occasionally I'd help, but it got to the point, where I didn't even wait for him or her to finish their first sentence without me saying, "Nope, sorry. I don't have any cash on me. Sorry." And then I'd walk away, sometimes even before they officially asked me for money! And for this I felt bad, but not enough to stop or change my plan of getting to and from places, including the church with a homeless ministry (to which we donated at the end of the conference) and my hotel.

And if this reality wasn't enough to make me feel bad, I was also getting some phone calls from someone back in Nebraska asking me for help again. Of course I had to say, "sorry I can't help you this time," which I probably would have said in person, had I been here.



In response to which, the following two texts were sent to me: "Where is the love of God?" "I'm sure not feeling it!" I also got phone calls from my bank telling me someone I had tried to help before I left was now trying to alter my personal check to him, hence my personal bank account was even closed temporarily on the first day of my trip, due to the threat of someone doing something they weren't supposed to with the "help" I was willing to give. Sigh.

Oh, how exhausted Jesus must have been, knowing he had absolutely everything people really needed, and I can't even find it within myself to help the poor in spirit right in front of my face, without feeling jaded and put out by others in need. What kind of a Christian am I? Truthfully, I'm just not where I'd like to be. How about you?

Every day is a new day and a day for me to breathe in God's presence and hope I am up to the task to respond appropriately with the presence of God...instead of saying, "I'm sorry your life sucks right now, but I just can't help you right now. I'm on vacation in Texas." (Something else I found myself texting recently!) Yet, this week, I also heard preaching on John 4 (The Woman at the Well) and on Luke 10 (The "Good Samaritan" Parable), and on Luke 15 (The Parable of the Lost Son). Lectures and sermons on these passages warned us preachers - about how we have the chance to paint the picture of who exactly are the questionable people are in the story. And how one can easily make terrible judgements on depicting who is who in a story, thus cutting and choosing who gets helped and is "good" in a story. Just like when I left after a lecture/sermon and would get asked personally several times a day to make a decision to help or not help someone. God's word played in my head saying: "The King (Jesus) will reply, "Truly I (continued on next)

tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." (from Matt. 25:40) And suddenly I want to be the "Good" Samaritan/ neighbor who attends to others with the same compassion Jesus does through all these stories. When I am acting on behalf of the "Lord of Love," quite literally, I want to do my best to use the resources I've been given the authority to use wisely to help those truly in need, and yet still offer what I can personally on more questionable cases. The day before I came back to work, this was the focus of my daily devotional from the Upper Room, which prayed: "Dear Father, help us always to remember your command to love our neighbors as ourselves. Continue to fill us with compassion for the least among us. As Jesus taught us, we pray, *"Father, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come. Give us each our daily bread. Forgive us our sins, for we also forgive everyone who sins against us. And lead us not into temptation (Luke 11:2-2, NIV)* Amen."

Mission Possible: Special Offering Update

Thanks, again, to all who supported the special offerings, a total of **\$4,226**, during Lent and Easter, to support our Youth Mission trip to New Orleans and to the Nebraska Synod Debt Reduction Fund for first-call pastors.

Summer breakfast monies will go to the Siena/Francis House Homeless Shelter, 1702 Nicholas Street. Founded in 1975, the <u>Siena/Francis House</u> is Nebraska's largest shelter, providing food, emergency shelter and clothing, along with outreach/case management to homeless families and individuals from Omaha and surrounding communities. The Siena/Francis House also houses a residential chemical addictions treatment center, a day services center, an employment training program, and a medical clinic. They have an "open door" policy, in that they try to never turn away anyone who comes to them in need.

Tim Sully, Development Director of Siena/ Francis House, will join us for worship and breakfast on **Sunday, June 4**. He will share a bit about the mission of Siena Francis House and answer any questions at breakfast.

All Lord of Love folks are invited to participate in an hour-long tour of the Siena/Francis House on **Saturday**, **June 24 at 9 a.m.** Those wishing to carpool



from the church should meet at 8:15 a.m. and be ready to leave by 8:30; otherwise, meet at the main entrance, 1702 Nicholas, at 9 a.m.

Interview with Rex Quadhamer

How have you seen God's love in your life? When people are kind and generous toward others because God's love has touched them. When I volunteered to collect money from people at Hy-Vee last year for a food pantry for holiday meals, I was touched by the response. Even though we were just asking for \$5 or \$10, it added up to close to \$500. There was something special in our interaction as we talked about helping people in need. I remember one man came just to spend \$5 for spaghetti and sauce, and he handed me a \$20 bill.

What gifts has God given to you, and how do you use those gifts?

I like music. I'm good at math. I like sports and was an athlete in high school. Hopefully I have some leadership ability, and of course faith. I've participated in the Lord of Love brass for 31 years. I've sang in the choir off and on for the same period. I've coached baseball, basketball, and soccer teams as my kids were growing up. I was a den leader in cub scouts. I've served on the church council on the ecumenics committee, property committee, and stewardship. I'm part of the Men's Breakfast when I can make it and love helping them put on breakfasts and activities they sponsor.

What is your favorite bible verse? Why?

Right now my favorite is Hebrews 12:2. "Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God." This was the verse in one of our devotions of our high school class. It reminds me not to put my trust in other things that will pass away.

Is there one thing Lord of Love does in helping our neighbors that really touches your heart?

When we've collected things for Siena/Francis House and Project Hope, I've delivered 100 Ibs. of bagged sugar to Project Hope and watch them put it right on their shelves as they were out. When delivering warm socks or bedding to Siena/Francis, they tell me thanks and there was a great need for these items.

Blood drives. Habitat for Humanity. Sending money to Tanzania to the orthopedic hospital so patients can afford to fix broken bones [see photo!]. This list can fill a page if I go on!!!
