

15 When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter. "Simon son of John, do vou love me more than these?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my lambs." 16 A second time he said to him, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Tend my sheep." <sup>17</sup> He said to him the third time, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" Peter felt hurt because he said to him the third time. "Do you love me?" And he said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep. -John 21:15-17

While this text is an "after-the-resurrection" text, I believe it is an appropriate one for us to look at during the season of Lent. As we know, before Jesus hung on the cross, Simon (Peter) claimed he would never leave Jesus even if everyone else did. However, Simon not only deserted Jesus, but he even denied knowing Jesus three times before the cock crowed that next morning.

BUT Peter still dearly loved Jesus and wanted to follow him, so when Jesus asks him three times after the resurrection, "Do you love me?" Peter was hurt, and even more so when Jesus asked him three times if he loved him. Yet, each time Peter hurtfully declared that he loved Jesus, Jesus would then tell him, "Feed my sheep." "Tend my sheep." "Feed my sheep."

During the season of Lent, I feel like we are to take stock of this question for ourselves, especially bearing the choices we have made in the past and the things we have chosen to devote our time, energy and money to, as Jesus asks, "Do you love me?" How do you think you would respond? I don't know, but I think having to say, "Yes, I love you"



the first time is actually easier than saying for the second and third time, "Yes, I love you." Repeated questions make us feel like we are being questioned on our motives and if we can be trusted by the answer we are saying and the way we are living. Now that's where superficial statements, and needing to be real and honest with our thoughts, come into question.

Yet, every time Simon repeats himself saying "Yes, I love you!" Jesus seems to set a mission before him. To feed and care for his people. And guite honestly, I think God asks the same of us, "Do you love me," and if so, "Will you feed and care for my sheep?" And that after each time love is professed Jesus responds, naming a little different nuance in the Greek. The first time Jesus tells Simon to "feed his little lambs" (probably like you would a baby by nurturing them with love and feeding them milk). The next time he says "tend my little sheep," asking Simon Peter to care (and watch over) Christ's little sheep (which could simply mean those who belong to Him, but that might also include lost sheep). And the third time, Simon is asked to "feed my little sheep"—which has the same nuance as far as the sheep part, but the work to be done of "feeding" (continued on next)

(continued from previous) could be actually feeding others with food, or even feeding them with the good news of Jesus Christ. However, don't these things all boil down to what Jesus named as the two greatest commandments? 1. Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul and mind, and 2. Love your neighbor as yourself.

During Lent, we ponder God's love to us through the suffering of his Son and the humiliation and pain that were endured so that our sin would no longer be able to separate us from God. I think the question, "Do you love me?" comes with some shame and a chance to refocus our ways to the ways that God has called us to, such as loving God with all that we are, and loving and caring for our neighbor by making sure all are fed, cared for and would know that our loving actions come out of response to the love and commands God has already given us. This, my friends, is the calling I believe God gives to us always, but especially during Lent.



### **ELCA World Hunger**



One billion human beings are hungry today. One billion people do not have enough to eat. The number alone is staggering. But what makes it scandalous is the fact that God's abundant creation—the fertile earth and seas—can produce adequate nutrition. Scarcity is not the problem. The problems (and the solutions!) lie in access, stewardship and public will. We know what to do. This is both an indictment and a cry of hope.

Indeed, this is a time of hope for hungry people. There are signs of hope in international sustainable development, in popular culture and in our own church. In this country, there is significant momentum to reform foreign assistance—to do the things that we know work, but that have received inadequate attention, such as investing in small-holder

agriculture and local farmers, and focusing on maternal and child nutrition.

In popular culture, there is a growing interest in food production systems, sustainable agriculture, environmental impacts of food production, and the ethics of eating. People are asking how their daily choices in each of these areas connect to hunger, poverty and health at home and abroad.

In our own church, the signs of hope are very strong. Lutheran commitment to the work of ELCA World Hunger remains high. Rejecting simplistic approaches, Lutherans supporting this work recognize the need for comprehensive, multi-pronged efforts to address hunger internationally and domestically. Through short-term relief and longer-term emergency sustainable development that addresses the root causes of hunger, we help communities lift themselves out of poverty into self-sufficiency.

But churches and other nonprofit organizations cannot accomplish this work alone—the decisions of governments and corporations have enormous impact on the lives of the hungry. (continued, next)

Just as Luther spoke out on behalf of the poor, so must the caring and prophetic voice of the faithful be heard today crying out for fair and equitable policies for poor and hungry people. To be effective, the ELCA's commitment to ending hunger takes the form of interconnected strategies in relief, development, education and advocacy.

One of the most frequently marked items in the Section "Helping those in Need" was "Donating Items to the Food Pantry." In fact, more than 53 of you indicated that you would like to donate food! That is good news for the 233,350 Nebraskans that struggle with hunger. That number includes almost 86,000 children, or to put it another way, **one in six** Nebraskan children struggle with hunger.

Each month, we will try to highlight some of the urgent needs of our local food banks. Some of the most needed food items remain: peanut butter, macaroni & cheese, canned tuna and chicken, cereal, pancake mix, canned fruit & vegetables, pork & beans, pasta and sauce, and boxed meals. Money donated to a specific food bank is always appreciated also.

Please consider donating this month. For the month of March 2018, here are just some of the current needs from Project Hope:

- Cereal
- Pancake mix
- Canned soup (consider low sodium)
- Canned meat


