Blow, Spirit, Blow, and be with us on the GO!

[Jesus said,] ¹³“When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own, but will speak whatever he hears, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. ¹⁴He will glorify me, because he will take what is mine and declare it to you. ¹⁵All that the Father has is mine. For this reason I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you.”

-John 16:13-155

Summer activities are coming into full swing as lives are ever changing in a “summer” transitional way. Yet even as these transitions find us scattered to many different places, the gift of the Spirit speaking the truth to us is still the truth, no matter where we find ourselves. And this Spirit of truth cannot be contained in one place, especially within the four walls of a church building. Instead, the Spirit is found wherever faith is found, and wherever we witness to God’s love given to us through Jesus, and the grace of God that has been given to us.

If you missed the Pentecost worship (like I did), then you missed hearing that we are to **“Go out in the world and tell everybody the good news!”** This is what God declared to Jesus on Earth, and what Jesus turned around and declared to us: “Go!” And when it comes to the Spirit, “Go” is the perfect word, because the Spirit never stops moving! It is always up to things—many that we can see, but even more that we don’t see. It is constantly renewing our faith, transforming our hearts, our minds, and bringing about new ideas and ways in which God’s love can be made known to us in deeper ways, along with the many ways in which the Spirit is using us to declare the truth of God’s love to others.



The Lord of Love garden (*above*) is a prime example of this, as you grow food to feed others who cannot afford to purchase fresh produce for their families. The quilts of love are another great example of ways you share love, along with the high volume of Project Hope donations that some of you have requested in honor of your special events in your life, be it retirement, a birthday, etc. All of these things are God’s love and witness to the world at work through your lives!

However, as on the day of Pentecost, while actions often speak louder than words, words are also a powerful tool God has invited us to use. It was really powerful when the good news of Jesus Christ was shared on Pentecost and spoken in people’s native languages, and it is still powerful when we hear it spoken in ours and people witness the power of God at work in their lives still today.

While not many of you have been brave enough yet to share on Sunday mornings when I ask, “How have you have seen God at work in your lives during the week?” I know that just by asking that question, many of you have been more conscious of how God is at work in our lives and have shared your God sightings (*cont. on next*)

Asking questions like this opens the door for us all to see the Spirit at work in new and exciting ways—as does praying for one another, serving others in the name of God’s love, gathering to hear God’s Word read and proclaimed to us anew wherever our summer adventures take us, and remembering to bless one another as people “go” on new adventures, even if it is in our sleep.

When we practice faith like this, we witness and help others also see the truth that God is with us always and is constantly at work in our lives. May the Spirit blow mightily through your lives and the lives of those whose paths you cross this summer and be found blowing in all the places you go!

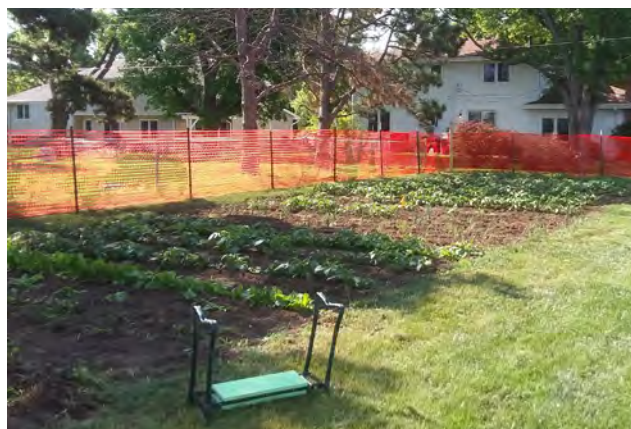
Community Garden

May Council Meeting Minutes

Lord of Love Church Council met on May 15, 2018 and the following are some of the discussions:

- Financial report for April 2018 improved from March.
- After several months of discussion and prayer, the Council voted not to participate in the Transformational Ministry program at this time.
- Members reviewed and made final edits on the job descriptions for the co-directors of faith formation (one with emphasis on youth ministry and the other on Christian education).
- Members were asked to get their committee's technology concerns to the council president by next month for a possible formation of technology team(s).
- Resources shared that asphalt repairs are about three weeks away because of weather issues. Thermostats in fellowship hall and narthex were donated and installed.
- Outreach reported that there will soon be a new banner for summer worship schedule.
- Worship discussed plans for a service in conjunction with the Family Picnic in July at Mahoney State Park planned by the Men's Group.

Next month's meeting will be June 19, 2018, at 7 p.m.

Teaching Stewardship to Kids, by Heather Hansen

A year ago for Christmas, my kids received \$20 each from their aunt and uncle – this was to spend not on themselves but to give to a charity of their choice. After much thought and searching, they found out there were many charities or places they could put the money towards good use. My daughter has a friend who has Type 1 Diabetes and decided she wanted to help in the search for a cure, so she made a donation to the JDRF foundation. My son decided to help the homeless and used the money to purchase items to be donated to the Siena Francis House.

For our neighborhood cleanup day, we volunteered to help pick up trash and debris around the neighborhood pond. The kids were surprised about how much trash they collected and were good about crawling into shrubs to get what was stuck underneath them. They enjoyed seeing the turtles, frogs, ducks and geese that had made the pond their home. I think that made them feel good that they helped make it a better place for them to live.

When we teach kids about stewardship it pushes them away from the "give me" mentality and puts them on track to caring for other people and the world.

Stewardship activities teach kids how to use time, money and skills responsibly. In a religious sense, children learn that they are caretakers of the gifts given by God. Donating money (tithing) to the church is a major form of stewardship, but you can also take a universal approach to helping others and the Earth by being a good steward.
