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Dear friends in Christ,
We are headed into the “most wonderful time of the year.” The problem is that our preparations of looking and being like the perfect people ready to celebrate the perfect Christmas, while well-intentioned, completely miss the mark on what the season of Advent is really about: preparing our hearts to receive Christ anew.

With that said, it is my goal to spend more intentional time waiting in God’s presence and listening to God speaking life to my soul, rather than trying to fill it with all the unnecessary “extras”. And since this is my goal, I’ll be inviting you to join me in this endeavor during our midweek advent services, not as something more to do, but as a way to intentionally take time to be still in the presence of God and let God’s presence speak to your soul.

This might mean different things to each of you. For one friend, it meant getting up 15 minutes earlier to pray and drink a cup of coffee intentionally not rushing before getting to the tasks of the day. For others, that might mean journaling at the beginning and/or the end of the day, dwelling on where Christ was present and ways God’s blessings made themselves known either through Christ’s presence, or how we think God used our life to speak life and blessing into someone else’s. For some, it might mean carving out intentional time and space in one’s day to add Advent Devotions.



We'll get organized and head out to go caroling no later than 12:30 p.m., and be back to the church by 2:30-3 p.m.

Tai Chi Begins

Joan Witt and Paula Foster are now certified Tai Chi for Balance instructors. Lord of Love will have two classes per week in the Fellowship Hall, **starting Jan. 8, 2020.**

Classes will be held **Wednesdays from 4:30 until 5:30 p.m. and Saturdays 9 to 10 a.m.** All adults, men and women, are welcome to attend. If you want to invite friends from the community, that would be great. There is no charge for the sessions. Joan and Paula would like to know who plans to attend, so we can plan for space. It would be great if you can attend both classes each week, but if not, please attend when you are available.

A pre- and post-assessment will be conducted on each participant for research purposes. Research is a cornerstone for outcome measures and is used as a connection for funding and support. The data (last names are not used) is sent to Tai Chi for Balance, sponsored by Friendship Program, Eastern Nebraska Office on Aging and CHI Health. Each individual will complete a health history and two balance measures. The post assessment will be at the completion of the 12-week session.

10 Benefits of Tai Chi:

Studies from the National Safety Council show improvement in:

1. Balance: Tai Chi movements are steady and slow, shifting from one side to the other with coordinating upper body movements. These movements help the "core" regain balance and reduces the risk of falling.

2. Strength and Endurance: Research shows that individuals who practiced Tai Chi at least 2-3 times a week on a regular basis, have had higher strength and performance levels.



3. Flexibility: In Tai Chi, the range of movements helps improve flexibility.

4. Posture: Tai Chi helps maintain good posture.

5. Chronic Illness Prevention: Tai Chi helps with holistic treatment of chronic illnesses such as heart disease, blood pressure control, arthritis, digestive disorders, depression and others.

6. Coordination: Tai Chi helps with eye/hand coordination as well as upper and lower body coordination.

7. Regulation of the Respiratory System: Breathing is one of the three parts of Tai Chi. The deep breathing helps treat respiratory ailments such as asthma, bronchitis and emphysema.

8. Aerobic Capacity: Tai Chi helps improve aerobic capacity; researchers report that it is a form of aerobic exercise as well.

9. Stress Reduction: The mellow rhythmic movements and breathing helps distract from a hectic lives style. The breathing coordination along with the eye/hand movement is proven to promote a sense of being calm.

10. Confidence: The power of the mind has immense potential. By practicing Tai Chi, a person becomes mentally focused and serene. The person will have more confidence while walking. It also helps a person focus on their surroundings.

It is a great honor to provide this instruction; Joan and Paula look forward to having you join the Tai Chi for balance classes!

Mission Possible Update

Remember that our special offerings for the Thanksgiving service, Wednesday night Advent services, and Christmas are designated for the ELCA AMMPARO program. The Noisy November offerings are also going to support AMMPARO.

AMMPARO stands for Accompanying Migrant Minors with Protection, Advocacy, Representation and Opportunities. It is a commitment by the ELCA, as a church in the world, to accompany vulnerable children today and in the future. Not only does the program provide resources and staff to assist with unaccompanied minors through the immigration court processes and related social services, work is done with local organizations in the troubled Central American countries of El Salvador, Guatemala, and Honduras.

One of the ELCA AMMPARO strategies encouraged by the Nebraska Synod is the Guardian Angel Program, whereby volunteers attend immigration court hearings for unaccompanied minors. Several Lord of Love members are Guardian Angels. They are a visible

presence of spiritual support, and they monitor proceedings to be sure judges are acting according to international immigration laws.


