

## **Covid Survey Summary - Part 2**

This is the second summary of the recent survey completed by 76 Lord of Love members.

## 1. This question asked about your feelings regarding the proposed guidelines.








Over 71% of respondents indicated the guidelines seem reasonable and appropriate. Nearly 28% feel that there is room for some relaxation of the guidelines. It appears that people are generally in favor of the guidelines that have been developed, but possibly understand the need to review and update the guidelines as conditions change overtime.

## 2. The next question asked for specific support for various provisions of the guidelines.

What precautions do you agree with and expect to be in place for indoor worship gatherings?


There was significant support for wearing facemasks, social distancing, providing hand sanitizer, no touch offering collection, new method of serving communion, and sanitizing the space between services (85% to 93% agreement), Limited touching of doors, avoiding physical contact, limiting handouts, and no congregation singing had a smaller

level of agreement (59% to 73%). These responses show a good level of agreement, but point out the areas that may need more explanation for the guideline or further consideration for alternatives.

## 3. This last question for this summary is in regards to attendance levels at in-person worship.

Which of the following describes the level of worship attendance you would be comfortable attending?

Normal seating is not a viable option to allow us to enforce appropriate social distancing and has limited support. Most people (75%) favor one half to one quarter seating. 13% favor about three quarter seating and 10% are not sure what to think. At this time, the sanctuary is set-up in one configuration to ensure a 6-foot separation of seating for family units up to 6 people. Some adjustment to the set-up may be applied before we begin in-person worship.
