

P: Blessed be the holy Trinity, \oplus one God, who creates, redeems, and sustains us and all of creation. **Amen.**


Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another. *Silence is kept for self-reflection.*

O Lord, you are my God; I will exalt you, I will praise your name; for you have done wonderful things, plans formed of old, faithful and sure. For you have made the city a heap, the fortified city a ruin;

the palace of aliens is a city no more,

it will never be rebuilt.

Therefore strong peoples will glorify you;

cities of ruthless nations will fear you.

For you have been a refuge to the poor,

a refuge to the needy in their distress,

a shelter from the rainstorm and a shade from the heat.


