First Reading: Jeremiah 14:7-10, 19-22

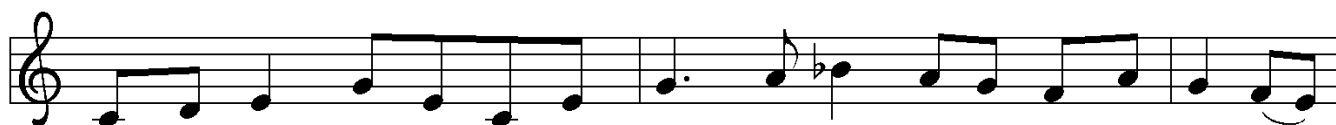





P: Lord, remember us in your kingdom and teach us to pray.


