Our color is white to suggest light, joy, and the celebration of our Lord. Gold can also be used to represent royalty.

so that we may delight in your will and walk in your ways,


to the glory of your holy name.

# Second Reading: Colossians 1:11-20







P: Lord, remember us in your kingdom and teach us to pray.


