Ringing of the Bell

*Greeting

*Confession and Forgiveness

P: Mothering God, enfold us in your loving arms as we prepare to confess our sin and receive your forgiveness. We know that we need your comfort now. **Amen.**

Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another.

Brief pause for reflection

Loving God,

we confess that we have turned away from your comfort time and time again. We thought that we could go our own way and that we did not need you. We have made a mess of our lives and of our world. Have mercy upon us, we pray, Amen.

Hear this good news! God, + forgives you all of your sin. Feel the loving arms of God wrapping around you now. Find comfort against God's bosom. Dry your eyes and be set free. Let us stand together, my siblings, as we cry, "Prepare the way of the Lord!" In Jesus' Name.

*Lighting of the Advent Wreath Litany

P: By the light of this second candle, we receive your *comfort now*. By your Spirit, may all of the pain and sorrow that we carry be shouldered by this beloved community. We are not alone, for you are with us and we are with one another. Through the power of mutual aid, we have everything that we need. Our *peace* comes through our willingness to share the abundance that you have given to us. In Christ Jesus, we pray. **Amen.**

P: The peace of Christ be with you always. And also with you.

Please share signs of peace with one another. Please be seated.

Prayers of the People / Gathering Song

O Come, O Come Emmanuel, and ransom captive Israel, That mourns in lonely exile here until the Son of God appear. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to you, O Israel.

L: God with us, you were born to free us from all that holds us captive. We pray for all people who feel entangled, trapped, and bound by their own sin, by their own fear, by their own despair. Release them into your arms of rescue and relief and surround them with your love and grace. Come, Lord Jesus. **Come now.**

O Come, O Wisdom from on high, embracing all things far and nigh: In strength and beauty come and stay; teach us your will and guide our way. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to you, O Israel.

L: God with us, your wisdom and ways are higher than our own. We pray for a world where things often feel hopeless and people live in conflict. Bring justice to the oppressed and to those living on the margins. Usher in peace where war and violence entangle and ensnare. We also lift up to you those on our prayer list and the names we speak either aloud or silently in our hearts to you now...*(pause)* Come, Lord Jesus. **Come now.**

O Come, O King of nations, come, O Cornerstone that binds in one: Refresh the hearts that long for you; restore the broken, make us new. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to you, O Israel.

L: God with us, you are our Shepherd King. We pray for your Holy Church, that we might live out the promise of your kingdom. Teach us to serve others instead of wanting to be served. Unite us as one body, broken for the sake of the world. Come, Lord Jesus. **Come now.**

P: The Lord be with you. And also with you.

Lift up your hearts. We lift them up to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give God thanks and praise.

*Thanksgiving at the Table

P: Holy One, the beginning and the end, the giver of life:
Blessed are you for the birth of creation.
Blessed are you in the darkness and in the light.
Blessed are you for your promise to your people.
Blessed are you in the prophets' hopes and dreams.
Blessed are you for Mary's openness to your will.
Blessed are you for your Son Jesus,
the Word made flesh.

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me. Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.


All praise and glory are yours, Holy One of Israel, Word of God incarnate, Power of the Most High, one God, now and forever. **Amen.**

Introduction & Instructions (Lori Vandeventer): Welcome everyone to Bethlehem! Let us open our eyes and ears and listen to the story of when Christ was born.

Part I: Mary and Joseph


The Marys and Josephs are invited forward.

Narrator 1:

Mary and Joseph, a pitiful sight. So tired and dirty, they gave me a fright. Sickly or dying? What was the matter? "A room in the inn?" Impossible chatter! "My rooms are all taken; not one empty bed. There'll not be a room in all Bethlehem," I said. But their eyes told a story of hunger and need. I couldn't avoid them, so I tried a good deed. I cleaned up the stable: Rachel cooked up a meal. We helped all we could, at least, that's how I feel. For we noticed that Mary was expecting – and soon! So we prepared for delivery right under the moon. The child came so quickly. His face seemed a light. As if God had shone God's presence so bright. Joseph said softly, "It's Jesus, my friend." God sent him among us to bring to an end fear and hatred, darkness and sin. Instead, God gave light, to let God's love in.

Part II: The Animals

As the animals come forward, the congregation sings "The Friendly Beasts."



Narrator 2:

My animals were calm, quieter than normal.

They often were noisy, and never too formal.

They always were eating, or else they were sleeping.

The stable required continuous sweeping.

But on Christmas night, they were strangely in awe

at the sight of the babe and all that they saw.

It's as if they were aware that God had just hushed them,

Had fed and watered and carefully brushed them.

They knew, I believe, that God had been able to work a miracle there in that stable.

Part III: Angels

As the angels come forward, the congregation sings "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing."

Hymn: "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing" ELW 270, v.1

Narrator 1:

We don't often see angels in flight.

But on the first Christmas, they lit up the night.

They appeared to the shepherds and, boy, were they scared!

"Angels!" cried one. "Will any lives be spared?"

"Are they here to destroy us? Is our time on earth up?

Have we seen our last day? Have we drunk our last cup?"

But "Peace on earth; goodwill to all" was the angels' sweet song; that was their call. With a light show that dazzled all who did see, the angels hallelujah'ed and sang out with glee.

"To Bethlehem, shepherds!" the angels directed.

"To see Jesus the Christ, whom God has perfected."

"Go worship the Lord and follow his ways.

And you'll find Christmas joy for all of your days."

Part IV: Shepherds

As the shepherds come forward, the congregation sings "Go Tell It on the Mountain."

Hymn: "Go Tell It on the Mountain"ELW 290, v.1-2

Narrator 2:

The shepherds, I told you, were scared and stunned.

"Too much hard work or too much hot sun!"

That's what they thought; that's how they explained.

Perplexed and afraid, they loudly complained.

But the angels' song calmed them, and then they believed.

They rejoiced when they knew and they were quite relieved.

They went to the stable and worshiped the Lord.

Then they left and began to spread the good Word.

Part V: Wise Persons and Star

The Wise Persons are invited to come forward and follow the "Star" around, while the congregation sings "We Three Kings."

Narrator 1:

The star that shone brightly led Wise Persons at night To Bethlehem's stable, to the manger's strange light. They came bearing gifts, in worship and love, praising God for God's wonders from heaven above. The Wise Men were kings and they knelt on my straw. It was the oddest of things that ever I saw. If kings bring him treasure, then maybe you, too, can worship with pleasure the person of Jesus, who came to us all. So worthy of praise, for he brings us God's call." "I am the way, the truth, and the life, Come to God for healing from strife. Come unto me, all you who labor, And I'll give you rest forever to savor."

Part VI: Conclusion
