Romans 12:1-8 (Living Bible) - This was Marilyn's call to administrative work.

And so, dear brothers and sisters, I plead with you to give your bodies to God because of all he has done for you. Let them be a living and holy sacrifice—the kind he will find acceptable. This is truly the way to worship him. Don't copy the behavior and customs of this world, but let God transform you into a new person by changing the way you think. Then you will learn to know God's will for you, which is good and pleasing and perfect.

Because of the privilege and authority God has given me, I give each of you this warning: Don't think you are better than you really are. Be honest in your evaluation of yourselves, measuring yourselves by the faith God has given us. Just as our bodies have many parts and each part has a special function, so it is with Christ's body. We are many parts of one body, and we all belong to each other.

In his grace, God has given us different gifts for doing certain things well. So if God has given you the ability to prophesy, speak out with as much faith as God has given you. If your gift is serving others, serve them well. If you are a teacher, teach well. If your gift is to encourage others, be encouraging. If it is giving, give generously. If God has given you leadership ability, take the responsibility seriously. And if you have a gift for showing kindness to others, do it gladly.

I Corinthians 10:13 (NRSV)-This is the verse that kept Marilyn going in rough times.

No testing has overtaken you that is not common to everyone. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tested beyond your strength, but with the testing he will also provide the way out so that you may be able to endure it.



Gospel: John 14:2-7

(Jesus said,) "In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also. And you know the way to the place where I am going." Thomas said to him, "Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?" Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. If you know me, you will know my Father also. From now on you do know him and have seen him."





Obituary for Marilyn Joan Willer Thomsen

August 3, 1940 - April 22, 2025

Marilyn Thomsen, 84, died in Thousand Oaks, California, April 22, 2025.

She was born in Akron, Iowa, in 1940 to George and Ella Willer.

A memorial service is scheduled at Lord of Love, 10405 Fort St, Omaha, NE 68134, on May 16. Visitation will start at 5:30 p.m. and the service at 6:30 p.m. Burial is scheduled May 17 at 11 a.m. at Riverside Cemetery, Hwy 12 and C16 in Akron, Iowa.

In lieu of flowers, donations to Lord of Love or the American Cancer Society are encouraged. Those who want to bring flowers are asked to bring a single rose, her favorite.

Marilyn Joan Thomsen was born in Akron in 1940 to George and Ella Willer, growing up on their farm outside of town.

Marilyn graduated from Le Mars High School and was the first person in her family to attend college, earning her bachelor's degree from the University of South Dakota.

After graduation, she went to work at Methodist Hospital in Omaha, Nebraska. She started as a medical technologist in the blood bank and over a 40-year career rose to manager of the pathology center.

Marilyn was an active member of Lord of Love Lutheran Church in Omaha, serving a variety of roles, including membership on the Church Council and Council President.

Marilyn survived breast cancer twice. Throughout her cancer journey, she engaged in many events supporting the American Cancer Society.

Later in her life, she moved west to be close to her son, daughter-in-law and grandchildren, first in Edmonds, Washington, then in Thousand Oaks, California.

Marilyn is survived by her son, Scott Thomsen; daughter-in-law, Lynn Thomsen; grandchildren, Savannah Thomsen, Jonathon Lamb, Blaise Lamb and Lexi Maloney; two great granddaughters; her brothers, Curtis Willer and Rolin Willer; and her sister, Karen Swanson and brother-in-law, Julian Swanson.

Marilyn was preceded in death by her parents.
