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## Bishop Scott Alan Johnson's June Reflection

"Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen." —Ephesians 3:20–21

Beloved in Christ.

This month, we bring our year of "Cultivating Love" to a close. Our Assembly theme for 2025 is "Imagine? Imagine! Imagine..." and I am excited to imagine with you in the months to come.

Paul's word of praise which serves as our scriptural foundation for this year's Assembly is both a word of promise and a word of challenge. We are reminded that God's abundance doesn't depend on our planning, effort, or resources alone, but neither are we called to wait passively – we have work to do! By the Spirit, we are part of something larger and more surprising than we can imagine on our own – but together, with the Spirit's guiding, God's church can faithfully live into its new future together.

## Imagine? Yes!

We can be a church that tries new things. What's possible for your church? Partner with a local full communion partner? YES! Make faith formation the work of the whole church and not one person? YES! Try something new that doesn't work, but teaches you what might? YES! God is inviting us to experiment and grow. The churches of the Reformation are called to always be re-forming for the sake of the Gospel.

## Imagine! WOW!

We are becoming something new; not because everything is settled or secure, but because God is moving among us in ways beyond our imagining. This is the Church That Is Becoming — flexible, relational, Spirit-led, grounded in the love of Christ. This is what brings us together to imagine what may yet be revealed to us, and to give thanks for what has been.

## Imagine... A-HA!

Imagine a church that focuses on the good we can do in this moment, with whomever is present to be part of that work... Imagine a church that knows why the love of Jesus makes a difference, and is learning how to share that love in word and in action... Imagine a church that is brave enough to ask tough questions and grace-filled enough to risk bold answers with each other. Imagine a church that treasures our connections with each other, believing that we are truly **one church, better together**...

God is drawing us into all of this and more as we imagine together this year. I look forward to imagining with you, according to that wondrous power that is at work within us. We move forward together with faith and good courage, trusting in the One who is accomplishing immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine.

# **Synod Assembly Summary**

The Nebraska Synod, ELCA gathered for its annual assembly May 30-June 1, 2025, in Kearney. The assembly worshiped, prayed, conducted business, and imagined



together. The theme of "Imagine! Imagine? Imagine..." guided the flow of the assembly, inspired by Ephesians 3:20. With the spirit and movement of jazz music under the direction of Dr. Jon Ailabouni, the assembly began and ended with rhythm, joy, praise and improvisation. Young adult lay leader, Kate Reynolds, from Family of Christ Lutheran in Kearney preached for opening worship, and Bishop Scott Johnson preached for closing worship, connecting the dots of how as the Nebraska Synod we are one church, better together. The assembly gathered with the Nebraska Synod's Companion synod partners from the Northern Diocese of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania with Bishop Fredrick Shoo, and from the United Evangelical, Lutheran Church in Argentina and Uruguay, Pastora Presidente Mariela Pereyra. Alison Richard, Program Director for Companion Engagement provided a report on behalf of the ELCA Churchwide organization and moderated a panel discussion with the bishops. In conducting the business of the synod, the assembly reelected, Gwen Edwards, to serve a second term as Synod Council secretary. The assembly discerned and approved the 2026 Nebraska Synod Budget. It also adopted synod resolutions: "Working for Justice and Peace," "Youth and Vulnerable Person Protection Policies and Safe Gathering Trainings," and "The Meaning of 'Israel' in Scriptural Context." Memorials to the 2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly were adopted regarding congregational constitutions and "For an End to the Occupation of Palestine and Recognition of Palestinian Statehood in the United Nations." A resolution regarding a "Bishop Election Process Option" was not adopted. Bishop Scott Johnson presented his annual report, naming some of the Spirit's activity as signs of God doing a new thing. He invited the assembly to imagine and wonder what God might be inviting. As one church, better together, we look forward to more upcoming Synod on the Road Again weekends, as well as to next year's assembly, May 29-31, 2026, in Kearney. Assembly Resources.
