Obituary for Sharon Louise Christiansen

Sharon Louise Christiansen was born on March 18, 1946 in Sidney, Montana to Ann K (Badt) and Alvin L. Christiansen. She grew up surrounded by a loving family, including maternal grandparents across the street and down two houses, and her favorite, Grandpa Tom. He lived with the family the first few years of her life, and it was said that Sharon held Grandpa Tom in her spell for the rest of his life. The family became complete with the addition of James L. (1947) and Kathryn A (1954).

Sharon was baptized and confirmed at Pella Lutheran Church in Sidney, attending Luther League and going to Bible camp at Brush Lake. Sharon attended school in Sidney, graduating with the class of 1964. She was a member of the high school band and discovered her love of literature in high school. Sometimes she even combined the two by reading a book as a pep band member during a basketball game or a rodeo while the action was going on around her.

After high school, Sharon left Montana to attend Dana College in Blair, Nebraska. Coming from a small town in "the middle of nowhere," to Dana in Blair seemed very exotic and she loved meeting new people from all over the country and the freedom that college provided. At Dana she made several lifelong friends and with one highlight was being flown home to Sidney in a friend's private plane at the end of summer.

Sharon's college education was interrupted for some time while she worked as a dishwasher at the Lalonde hotel in Sidney and as a nurse's aide at the Crowell Home in Blair. She often recounted walking home from Crowell Home after her evening shift on July 20, 1969 and seeing televisions glowing in all the homes as everyone watched the moon landing. Sharon continued her college studies over the years, but those last 6 credits of French remained elusive.

Sharon moved to Omaha, her final hometown, and after brief stints at factory and insurance jobs, she had found her niche as a Library specialist for the Omaha Public Library! Over the next forty years she worked for a time at every library branch but her favorite remained the Benson Branch, the one where she had started.

When Kathy moved back to Omaha in 1976, they became roommates for "just a while," which lasted almost 50 years. Their home was the one where friends gathered for gourmet meals or pizza, or sometimes just a movie viewed on that "new VCR thing." After discovering a love for European travel she made several trips, sometimes with a friend, but very often; by herself. She had become an independent strong woman.

Her life was enhanced by her beloved dogs which included the indomitable Ged (pantyhose story), the "free" sweet Bear (lots of vet bills), Polly the Cairn terrier (squeaky Funny Face), Katie the Westie (Christmas Eve spider bite), Fiona Rose, another Westie (lost all her fur and almost her life) and finally the sisters, Jade (McLady) and Chloe (Ann Marie). She cherished each and every one of them.

In the early 2000's Sharon became more interested in justice causes. Some of the non-profits she supported included Doctors Without Borders, the ACLU, the Southern Poverty Law Center, Planned Parenthood, ELCA Good Gifts, Heifer International and Loads of Love at Lord of Love.

Although reading remained a constant as her favorite hobby, she had many, **many** hobbies over the years. These included gourmet cooking, gardening, bobbin lace making, hardanger embroidery, cross stitch embroidery, tole painting, glass beading, altered books, scrapbooking, paper crafts, and most recently card making. One of the joys of retirement for her was more time for her crafts.

During the last several years of Sharon's life she struggled with many health issues which exacerbated her depression. She tried her hardest this last year to turn things around, but a fall in the early morning of July 21, 2025 was something from which she couldn't recover. Although the last week and a half of her life was excruciatingly hard, the last 30 minutes of her life on July 31, 2025 were calm and peaceful, surrounded by her family and friends, hopefully knowing that she was loved by so many and had always, *always* been a beloved child of God.
