Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable; it keeps no record of wrongs; 6 it does not rejoice in wrongdoing but rejoices in the truth. For now we see only a reflection, as in a mirror, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known. And now faith, hope, and love remain, these three, and the greatest of these is love.

Obituary for Ronald C. Thom

Ronald C Thom was born, along with his twin sister Roslynn, on August 10, 1951, in Fremont, NE to Elna and Paul Thom. The family later moved to Tecumseh, NE where Ron attended high school and developed his love for muscle cars and drag racing. Ron eventually grew out of drag racing, but never his love for hot rods.

After graduating from Tecumseh High School in 1969, Ron tried out many things over the next several years. He attended the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, left to work construction in Colorado Springs, returned to Nebraska to attend Peru State, before finally leaving college to find work and marry Jerryl Trout. They welcomed two boys into the world, Christian and Andrew. Despite being a lifelong Husker fan, Ron eventually became a Maverick and graduated from the University of Nebraska Omaha in 1996.

Ron was a long serving and active member of Lord of Love Lutheran church. He joined the congregation 1974 and remained a member at least until his death, but most likely still considers himself a member. Ron loved music and singing and was a member of the choir where he occasionally sang solos and performed special music. He also taught Sunday school and was a youth group sponsor. Ron was a proud member of Men's Breakfast and rarely missed one of their Saturday gatherings.

Ron began working at the Union Pacific Railroad in October 1992 where he met his second wife Brenda. He and Brenda were married at Lord of Love on November 24, 2001. They enjoyed a wonderful marriage as only best friends do.

Ron is preceded in death by his parents Elna and Paul Thom, sister Paulette Grable and brother-in-law Merle Grable. He is survived by his wife Brenda Thom; son Christian (Megan) Thom, grandchildren Spencer and Olive; son Andrew (Elizabeth) Thom and grandchildren Cobalt and Indium; stepdaughter Theresa Saucedo and grandchildren Maria and Annabelle Bochnicek; stepdaughter Janice (Stephen) Filbin and grandchildren Isabella and Julia; and his twin sister, Roslynn Thom.

Ron Thom was a big guy with a big heart. He made lifelong connections and friends wherever he went. He loved many things, but his greatest loves were his family and friends, classic cars, and Husker football (and not necessarily in that order). His warmth, humor, and the steadfastness of his love will be missed dearly.

He would have appreciated that quietly, as he rarely wanted the attention on himself. A man of faith, Ron carried it with him in ways that often seemed to bring miracles right out of his pockets. Some of those miracles were found in how he always seemed able to pull off the most unbelievable odds, but most importantly, in how deeply he cared for others and the generosity with which he lived. There was always a seat at his table, and when needed, he offered a helping hand that was kind but also steady and strong.

To him, family was family and that never just meant blood. One of his many miracles was the tremendous amount of love he had to give for his wife, sisters, children, stepchildren, grandchildren, nieces and nephews, his congregation, and his winning team, even when they weren't actually winning. His circle extended to dear friends who became lifelong family.

Ron never forgot a birthday or special occasion. He sent texts and reminders, and he would sing to you on your special day, always making sure you felt seen and loved. He could command a room with his booming voice, but more often it was filled with laughter, whether in his Santa Claus voice or with one of his unforgettable Olaf and Sven jokes. His heart belonged to his God and family first, church second, Huskers third, and a salt or sugar-rimmed margarita somewhere close behind, creating a sense of belonging for everyone lucky enough to be around him.

Above all, Ron cherished the joy of being surrounded by those he loved. For his family, he wasn't just a husband, father, grandfather, brother, uncle, and friend; he was a steady presence, a source of love, humor, prayer, and the reminder that we always had someone in our corner.
